FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, July 14, 2019– C

The Parable of the Good Samaritan is, perhaps, one of the most well known biblical parables. Through it, our Lord is challenging His followers, ourselves included, to do the unexpected and put others above ourselves. One way our love of God is reflected is through our love of neighbor. How will we grow in our love of neighbor today? How will we reach out especially to those neighbors of ours that we may struggle with? How shall we "go and do" what the Good Samaritan has done?

Over the past 800 years, the Holy Land Franciscans have been tasked with the care of the holy sites and ministry to our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. Each parish throughout the country supports this needed ministry every year through the Pontifical Good Friday Collection that is taken up during Holy Week. In a desire to bring the beauty of the Holy Sites, where salvation history itself occurred, to as many as possible, the Holy Land Franciscans built the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America. This monastery, located in Washington, DC, is featured on our bulletin cover this weekend.

Built in 1899, the monastery grounds includes the Memorial Church of the Holy Sepulchre. This church, designed in the shape of a Jerusalem cross, allows pilgrims a chance to experience the holy places on American soil. Upon entering the church, you find yourself standing outside of the site of Annunciation. This shrine is a replica of the home of Mary in Nazareth where the good news was first proclaimed by the Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin (Luke 1:26-38).

Moving from the site of the Annunciation, you are greeted by a long stairwell leading up to Calvary and the site of the Crucifixion. It is here that our Lord was lifted up upon the Cross and gave His life for us. Directly across from Calvary, the exact number of steps as it is in Jerusalem itself, is the Sepulcher, the tomb where our Lord's body was laid and from which He, three days later, rose from the dead. Between the two sites is the Anointing Stone, the stone slab on which our Lord's body was laid to be prepared for burial by Joseph of Arimathea.

Going into the crypt beneath the shrine, one is transported from the holy places in Jerusalem to the Catacombs of Rome. Following the intricate passageways, the pilgrim walks among a replica of the early Christian burial sites. The dimly lit walls are beautifully decorated with Christian symbols and imagery. Though a replica of the Roman Catacombs, the catacombs at the Monastery also serve as a burial place and shrine to two martyrs: St. Innocent, a 2nd Century child martyred for the Faith, and St. Benignus, a Roman soldier beheaded for the Faith.

The Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America is a hidden gem and one of several beautiful shrines in our nation's capital. I've been blessed to make use of the monastery as a place for prayer and reflect on our Lord's life throughout the summer. If you ever find yourself in Washington, DC, I would encourage you to make a pilgrimage to this shrine and experience the beauty of the Holy Land right here in America.
