

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — July 19, 2020

This weekend (July 18th/19th), the Church enters into the 16th Sunday in Ordinary. And, in our Gospel reading, we continue to hear from the third great discourse of our blessed Lord in St. Matthew's Gospel. Within St. Matthew's Gospel, our blessed Lord offers five discourses, or sermons, including: The Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), Instructions for the Missionary Life (Matthew 10), the Collection of Parables (Matthew 13), Instructions for Communal Living (Matthew 18), and the Sermon on the End Times (Matthew 23-25).

In these discourses, our blessed Lord imparts great wisdom to His disciples regarding the moral life, He explains how to go about spreading the Gospel, and He prepares His disciples for life in the Church and, eventually, in the world to come. The third discourse on the collection of parables, which we began last weekend, speaks to several parables that offer insight into the Kingdom of Heaven. In our Gospel reading today (Matthew:13:24-43), Jesus tells the parables of the wheat and the weeds, the mustard seed, and yeast mixed with flour

In the last two parables that we heard today of the mustard seed and the yeast (both of which are also found in the Gospels of St. Mark and St. Luke), our blessed Lord emphasizes how small things can become great things. Just as the mustard seed grows into a great bush and a little yeast can leaven the whole dough, so the smallest amount of faith can change the world. When we allow God into our lives, even in the smallest of ways, everything changes.

The first parable, that of the wheat and weeds, is exclusive to St. Matthew's Gospel. In it, the enemy sows weeds among the wheat and the two cannot be separated until harvest time arrives. They cannot be separated because they are not immediately distinguishable in the field and, when they mature enough to tell the difference, their roots are intertwined. The weeds are, at first, indistinguishable from the wheat. This reveals to us a simple truth: Sin is boring.

Sin is boring. Why is it boring? Because sin, like the devil himself, is not and cannot be creative. Only love (and God is love! [1 John 4:8]) is creative. When we fall into sin, it is because we are seeking after something that we love. But, in our sinfulness, we try to obtain it in the wrong way and through the wrong means. Everything on earth is meant to direct us to God. That is the proper end (telos) of every action. Sin stops actions short of God.


This is why sin never satisfies the human heart. To quote St. Augustine in the 4th Century, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in God." Why is this? Because we have been made by and for God. Or, to put it simply: Why do we exist? To know, love, and serve God. Anything else leaves our hearts wanting because only God will satisfy that longing. In the end, the weeds will be burned away and the wheat will remain. At the end of our lives, only that which was rooted in God will remain. May we dare to be creative today. May we dare to love. May we be courageous and live for God.

As we begin to prepare for the coming Fall, we are gearing up to resume our in-person Religious Education classes on Sunday, September 13th. As in previous years, our K-8th Grade Classes and Youth Group will meet between the 7:30 AM and 10:00 AM Masses on Sunday. Michelle, our Director of Religious Education, is hard at work to ensure that our classroom environments will follow all diocesan safety precautions related to COVID-19. If you are willing to serve as a Catechist or as a Classroom Assistant, please contact the Parish Office (824-1380) for more information.

Earlier this week, an adjuster from our insurance agent (Catholic Mutual) was on campus to review the roofs on our buildings. Due to the recent storms and high winds, he saw signs of storm damage. While this has not affected the interior of our buildings yet, it is a matter we will want to address to ensure the upkeep of our Church and our other buildings. As my first pastor taught me: "Preventative maintenance is the best kind of maintenance." Once we receive the adjuster's report, I will be reaching out to our Building Board, Parish Council, and Finance Council to see how we as a parish want to proceed with this necessary upkeep. More information to come.
