## SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-JULY 25<sup>TH</sup>, 2021

This weekend (July 24<sup>th</sup>/25<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Earlier this year, Pope Francis also dedicated this weekend to be the first annual **World Day for Grandparents and the Eldery**. In this celebration, we are called to honor all of our grandparents and the elderly, who are so important to our communities and our Church.

In the inaugural address for this day, Pope Francis speaks directly to grandparents and all the elderly, reminding us all that "there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions." Instead, we are called, as Jesus Himself tells Nicodemus (John 3:1-21), to always open our hearts to the working of the Holy Spirit. With this in mind, Pope Francis exhorts all grandparents and elderly to "take an active part in renewing and supporting our troubled societies."

In setting this celebration, our Holy Father has based it around the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin and grandparents to our Lord. Sts. Joachim and Anne are the patron saints of grandparents, whose feast is celebrated on July 26<sup>th</sup>. May all grandparents and elderly find friends in these two great saints who have played such an important role in salvation history.

## WELCOME GUESTS - DCN. BRUCE AND FR. BILL

This weekend, we are joined by **Dcn. Bruce Goodwin** at both our 7:30 AM & 10 AM Sunday Masses. Dcn. Bruce, son of the late Carl and Melba Goodwin, grew up in our parish for many years. Having eventually settled in Atlanta, he was ordained to the permanent diaconate this past year for the Archdiocese of Atlanta. He is visiting with us this weekend as he is in town for his high school reunion, which some here may be attending as well.

When a deacon assists at Mass, the deacon is often vested in a dalmatic, which, similar to the priest's chasuble, is a long tunic-like vestment. As the deacon is configured to Christ the Servant, they stand next to and assist the priest throughout most of the liturgy. Their liturgical ministry is focused in a special way on the service of the Gospel and of the altar, most especially to the Most Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

This service to the Gospel is seen as the deacon carries in the Book of the Gospels in the entry procession and proclaims the Gospel at the proper time. In addition, he will also proclaim the general intercessions, inviting us to prayer and to turn our needs to the Lord. In service of the altar, the deacon will assist in preparing the altar and, at the end of the Eucharist Prayer, elevate the chalice as the priest elevates the host. Finally, at the end of Mass, the deacon assists the priest in sending the faithful outward into the world.

In addition to welcoming Dcn. Bruce this weekend, we will also have the opportunity to welcome **Fr. Bill Sullivan** to our parish. Fr. Bill retired as the pastor of St. John the Baptist in New Haven this past June before moving to Ossian. As I've previously mentioned, a priest never truly retires. Though he steps away from administrative work, he continues to offer the Sacraments.

Fr. Bill, in his retirement, has offered to assist in offering the Sacraments at parishes as needed. When not assisting elsewhere, I've invited Fr. Bill to join us as a concelebrant at our weekend liturgies. Prior to his time in New Haven, Fr. Bill was my childhood pastor at St. Thomas the Apostle in Elkhart. This is a true joy unique to the diocesan priesthood: That I, as a priest, am able to welcome my childhood pastor, who helped me learn what it means to be a priest, to our parish.




