EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — August 2, 2020

This weekend (August 1st/2nd), the Church celebrates the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Having completed the third great discourse of St. Matthew's Gospel, we are now preparing to enter into the fourth discourse. In this discourse, our blessed Lord is preparing for the establishment of His Church here on earth. As seen in today's Gospel of the Feeding of the Five Thousand (Matthew 14:13-21), our blessed Lord gives the bread that He Himself blessed to those crowds gathered through the hands of His disciples. In the same way, the Church continues to hand on (trādere) to us that which our blessed Lord Himself has blessed.

Indiana Executive Order and Diocesan Safety Precautions

This past weekend, Governor Holcomb issued a new executive order regarding the requirement of face coverings in public areas. Please know that, as our diocesan directives are already in full compliance with this executive order, there will be no changes at this time to the general practices that we have already been observing in church. I thank you again for your patience and understanding as we strive to offer Mass while respecting the safety precautions put into place by Bishop Rhoades at all parishes in our diocese.

Summer Classes and Summer "Vacation"

This past week, I completed (and hopefully passed!) the final examinations in my last two courses, Procedural Law and Special Issues Lay Ministry, for this summer semester. I am "done" with classes until we begin the Fall semester online in three weeks. This Fall, my classes will include Supra-Diocesan Structures and Readings in Canonical Latin. During these next three weeks without classes, I am looking forward to working on a few projects around the parish and rectory.

I will also be taking a few days away from the parish on the weekend of August 15th/16th. On that Saturday, I will be witnessing the marriage of one of our parishioners and his fiancée at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church in West Lafayette, and, that Sunday, I will be in South Bend to baptize my nephew and spend a few days with my parents and siblings. We will be welcoming a visiting priest, whom I will announce in next week's bulletin/newsletter once all arrangements are finalized, for Confessions on Saturday and as the celebrant at our weekend Masses.

Adoration and Sacramentals

This coming Friday (August 7th) is the first Friday of the month and we will, as has become our parish custom, have "all day" Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Following the 11:30 AM morning Mass, the Most Holy Eucharist will be exposed in the Church for Adoration from Noon until 6:00 PM. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will conclude will Benediction, followed by our First Friday Votive of the Sacred Heart, offered according to the Extraordinary Form.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is an amazing thing. It is, in reality, the most amazing thing: The True Presence of Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread and wine. During times of adoration, we have the blessed opportunity to sit in the presence of Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist. As St. Clare of Assisi said in the 13th Century, it is our opportunity to "gaze upon Him, consider Him, contemplate Him, as we desire to imitate Him."

One might ask, "Can't we find God everywhere?" Yes, God's presence is reflected in all of creation. He is the Creator. But, the Most Holy Eucharist is different: It is no reflection; It is Christ Himself. On these hot, humid days of summer, we are reminded that water is present everywhere in the air. But, when we need to drink, we still must go to the well. We can and should reflect on the beauty of God in all of creation, but we still must go to the well, to Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist.




