TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — September 13, 2020

Entering into the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Sept. 12th/13th), we hear the closing portion of the fourth great discourse from St. Matthew's Gospel. Last weekend, we heard how to approach reconciliation with our brothers and sisters in our Christian community and how to approach reconciliation with God. Now, we hear of how important this reconciliation is to our conversion. As we experience God's infinite love and mercy in our lives, so must we exercise it with others.

Christianity is unique among religions in our belief in the intensity of God's love and closeness to us and God's desire to forgive us. That is not surprising since only Christianity enjoys the fullness of God's self-revelation in Jesus. God revealed himself in Jesus and revealed his closeness to us and desire to forgive us. Jesus is our model in forgiveness.

What Does It Mean To Be Catholic?

In the coming weeks, we'll be announcing the start date for our Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) sessions. Our weekly sessions will offer dynamic lessons and lively discussion regarding the fundamental teachings of our Catholic Faith. The sessions will be open to all individuals, parishioners and non-parishioners alike, who are interested in learning or re-learning the fundamentals of the Faith.

Our RCIA sessions are perfect for those who are Catholic and wish to deepen their knowledge about the Church, for those who are not Catholic but wish to learn what it means to be Catholic, and for those who wish to prepare for full initiation into the Church at the Easter Vigil. If you know of anyone interested in learning more about the Catholic Church, please consider personally inviting them to join us during these sessions (and consider journeying with them!).




