

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — September 20, 2020

This weekend (*Sept. 19th/20th*), the Church celebrates the **25th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Having completed the fourth discourse, we are now being prepared to receive the fifth and final discourse from St. Matthew's Gospel: **The Discourse on the End Times**. Though it is preparing us for the fifth discourse, our Gospel from today (*Matthew 20:1-16*) does offer us a beautiful insight over our theme of **reconciliation** from the past two weekends: It's never too late.

Just as in the parable of the workers in the vineyard, the Lord calls out to us at every stage of our life. It is never too late to respond. It is never too late to turn to the Lord. It is never too late to reconcile ourselves to God if we are but willing to ask His forgiveness. It is never too late to be reconciled with God. Turn to Him today.

What Does It Mean To Be Catholic?

Interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith? Join us on Thursday, October 1st, at 6:00 PM for an informal and informational gathering about our upcoming Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) Sessions. At this gathering, we will look at a brief overview of Church History and discuss what the RCIA Process looks like for all those who are interested.

Over the coming months, our RCIA sessions will provide us with an overview of the Catholic Faith. We will first look at the Creed, then the Commandments, and, finally, the Sacraments and Prayer. Our look at these topics will help to explain Catholic teaching and its basis, found through in the Sacred Scriptures.

Our RCIA sessions are open to all interested individuals: for those who are Catholic and wish to deepen their knowledge about the Church, for those who are not Catholic but wish to learn what it means to be Catholic, and for those who wish to prepare for full initiation into the Church at the Easter Vigil. If you know of anyone interested in learning more about the Catholic Church, please consider personally inviting them to join us during these sessions (and consider journeying along with them!).

Technology Updates: Digital Bulletin Board and Live-Streaming System

Thanks to the generosity of a parishioner, we have mounted a "digital bulletin board" in the narthex. Utilizing a wall-mounted television and a DVD Player, this system allows us to display up-to-date information regarding upcoming parish events. It will also be used to play picture slideshows, often shown during funeral visitations held in the narthex prior to the Mass of Christian Burial for our beloved deceased.

This past Friday, local **Stylus Technologies** began the installation of our new **live-streaming system** for the church. This system will utilize a high-definition camera placed near the choir loft, providing a full view of the church. It has the ability to swivel and zoom, allowing a wide-range of different camera angles to accommodate our various liturgies (*Mass, Stations of the Cross, etc...*). The system will be tied into the church sound system, providing the best quality sound for those joining us at home.

This upgrade from our current system will improve the experience of watching our liturgies for those parishioners who cannot yet join us in person at church. It will also become an invaluable tool that can be used to live-stream other liturgies, including funerals and weddings, to help include those family members who may not be able to travel for major events. We hope for the installation to be completed later this week. Thank you for your financial support of this project.

Reminder: Updated Friday Daily Mass Time

As a reminder, this week will mark a change in our daily Mass times: Starting this Friday (*Sept. 25th*), our **Friday daily Mass will now be offered at 8:30 AM**. All other daily Mass times remain the same (*Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday at 8:00 AM, Wednesday at 7:00 PM*).

In addition to our weekend liturgies, I would encourage you to consider attending at least one additional weekday Mass each week. No human words could adequately describe the graces available for assisting at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Remember, time with the Lord is never wasted.




