

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME — October 18, 2020

This weekend (*Oct.* $17^{th}/18^{th}$) marks the **29th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our readings continue to prepare us for coming of the fifth and final discourse of St. Matthew's Gospel on the End Times. We can, however. see a slight shift in thematic. We do not need to fear the end as Jesus is the end. We belong to Him. As Christians, this becomes the source of our hope and joy: That if we live and die with the Lord, we too shall rise with Him! In the end, we have nothing to fear because Christ Himself is with us.

PARISH UPDATES AND UPCOMING EVENTS

This past week, we've had several unexpected repairs pop-up around the parish. As we begin to shift our campus from "Summer" to "Winter" mode, that is not uncommon. What a joy it is to know that, when these unexpected expenses arise, we are prepared to face them thanks to your continued generosity to the monthly Repair / Rainy Day Fund. Thank you for your financial stewardship and support of our parish to help ensure that we have the facilities to serve all those who come through our doors for the years to come!

Speaking on generous financial stewardship, our stewardship in the Annual Bishop's Appeal allows us to reach beyond our own parish and offers assistance to an innumerable number of people throughout northern-Indiana. As you know, we are striving to have as close to 100% participation for this year's Appeal as possible. As of this week, we've already received pledge cards from 40% of our parish families. We're well on our way to 100% participation!

If you haven't yet had the opportunity to return your pledge, please try and do so at your earliest convenience. We will be sending out a second round of mailings to those who have not yet had a chance to respond. Even if you may not be in a position to financially support the appeal this year, please still return your pledge card so that we know that it was received. Returning the pledge card will also help save the parish on postage in the long-run. Thank you for your support, both spiritually and financially, for the 34th Annual Bishop's Appeal.

It's amazing to think that, as the end of the liturgical year nears, the beginning of **Advent** is only several weeks away. Planning for **Advent** and Christmas will be a bit different this year, but we will still be striving to do everything that we can to prepare together as a parish family to celebrate the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. Leading up to Advent, on Tuesday, November 17th, at 6:30 PM, members of our liturgical decorating committee will host a "Make Your Own Advent Wreath" event. Our Advent Parish Mission will be held in the Church (with accommodations in the Parish Social Hall for overflow seating if necessary). For those who may not be able to yet join us in person, each evening of the Parish Mission will also be live-streamed.

A NOTE FROM THE DIOCESE


It remains important for our Church to protect children and young persons from the evils of abuse. The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend remains committed to upholding and following its guidelines, policies and procedures that were implemented for the Protection of Children and Young People. These can be reviewed on the Diocese's website, www.diocesefwsb.org under "Youth Protection."

If you have reason to believe that a minor may be a victim of abuse or neglect, Indiana law requires that you report this to civil authorities. If you or someone you know was abused as a child or young person by an adult, you are encouraged to notify appropriate civil authorities of that abuse. In addition, if the alleged abuser is or was a priest or deacon of the Catholic Church, you are encouraged to contact Mary Glowaski, Victim Assistance Coordinator, (260) 399-1458, email: mglowaski@diocesefwsb.org, or Rev. Mark Gurtner, Vicar General of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, at P.O. Box 390, Fort Wayne, Indiana, 46801, or at (260) 399-1419, email: mgurtner@diocesefwsb.org. The Diocese is committed to helping prevent the abuse or neglect of children and young people and to assist those who claim to have suffered harm as a result of such abuse.


