

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - October 27, 2019

As a reminder, this <u>Friday</u>, <u>November 1st</u>, is a **Holy Day of Obligation** celebrating the **Solemnity of All Saints**. On this day, we rejoice with the Church Triumphant: Those men and women who have lived lives in imitation of our Lord Jesus Christ and are now united with Him in Heaven for all eternity. The love of God is so strong that even death itself cannot separate us from Jesus Christ (Romans 8:38-39). This also means that even death cannot separate us from our brothers and sisters in the Lord as we are all members of His Body, which is the Church. The Saints have become that great cloud of witnesses (Hebrews 12:1) that we join with through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in worship of God. Through their witness, they point us to Jesus; through their intercession, they aide us in growing in our relationship with Him.

To celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, we will offer a vigil Mass on Thursday, Oct. 31st, at 7 PM and Masses on Friday, Nov. 1st, at both 7 AM and 5:30 PM (incense may be used at this Mass). Following our 5:30 PM Mass on Friday, Nov. 1st, all are invited to join us in continuing our celebration in the Parish Social Hall for our Annual All Saints Day Party. Please sign-up in the Narthex or call the Parish Office if you plan to attend. (Reminder: Our children [and adults!] are invited to dress up as their favorite Saint and join in a procession at the beginning of the 5:30 PM Mass. Please arrive by 5:20 PM to join the procession.)

On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November 2nd</u>, we commemorate **All Soul's Day**. Having celebrated the lives of those in Heaven, we now pray for those who are undergoing purgation and being cleansed of all worldly imperfections (1 Corinthians 3:11-15) as they prepare for complete enjoyment of life with God in Christ. Purgatory, a state of post-mortem purification, exists; and, it is of benefit to those souls who are experiencing purification that we remember them in prayer (2 Maccabees 12:39-46), particularly at the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass. To put it another way, just as we can pray for someone's struggles in this life, we can surely do the same for them after death as we remain connected to one another through Jesus Christ.

For the Commemoration of All Soul's Day, we will offer Masses on Saturday, Nov. 2nd, at 8 AM and Noon. (Note: The Noon Mass will be a Requiem Low Mass offered in the Extraordinary Form, meaning the prayers will be prayed in Latin. Missalettes will be provided with Latin-English translations for the Noon Mass.)

Throughout the entire month of November, we are called to remember and pray for all those who have died (which is a spiritual work of mercy). We will continue our tradition of placing memorial candles alongside the statues of the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph in memory of our loved ones who are no longer with us. Please contact the Parish Office if you wish to participate in this beautiful tradition, or, if you have memorial candles from past years, please return them to the Parish Office by Wednesday, Oct. 30th. You are also invited to inscribe the names of lost loved ones in our parish's *Book of Prayer Intentions*, located in the narthex. When entering the Church, I'd encourage you to look at the names inscribed and, in your kindness, offer a prayer for the repose of the souls of all the faithful departed.
