Passion Sunday

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Passiontide marks the last two weeks of Lent This Sunday is called Passion Sunday, because the Church begins, for the next two weeks, to make the sufferings of our Redeemer her chief thought.

Why do we veil crucifixes and statues? In His sorrowful Passion, Jesus' face and whole body were so disfigured by the blows and scourages that Our Savior was scarcely recognizable.

"I am a worm and not a man." (Psalm 22:6)

Thus, the wounds Our Lord endured hid both His divinity and His Humanity. For this reason, we veil our crucifixes in the final days of Lent - hiding our Savior under the sad, purple cloth. The statues of the Saints, too, are covered. It is therefore befitting that if the glory of the Master is hidden, then His servants also should not appear.



Traditionally, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, one week before Palm Sunday, was called Passion Sunday or Judica Sunday after the first word of the Entrance Antiphon: "Iudica me, Deus" or "Give me justice, O God..." (cf. Psalm 43)

"Give me justice, O God, and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless. From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, for you, O God, are my strength."

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT - MARCH 21, 2021

This **Fifth Sunday of Lent** (March 20th/21st) is traditionally known as **Passion Sunday**. It marked the beginning of **Passiontide**, which formed a bridge between these last two weeks of **Lent** and **Easter**. This nearing end of the **Lenten season** is reflected in our liturgy today, which is full of premonitions of Jesus' coming Passion and Death. These premonitions come to a head in the final line of today's Gospel: "And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself.' He said this indicating the kind of death he would die" (John 12:32-33).

Though the end of **Lent** is nearing, it has not yet come. We do not want to become lax in our **Lenten observances**. Quite the opposite! As is reflected in our liturgical year, we should spend these next two weeks acting in a very intentional manner as we prepare for **Easter**. **Passion Sunday** leads us to **Palm Sunday**, which enters us into **Holy Week** and the **Sacred Paschal Triduum**, the three most sacred days of the Church year. Our liturgical celebrations intensify over these next two weeks, ensuring that Jesus Christ remains our sole focus. And, as it is in our liturgy, so must it be in our life.

As is our parish custom, we have covered the sacred images in the church with purple cloth between this Sunday and **Good Friday** (for the crucifix) and **Easter** (for all the other images). It might seem odd that, just as we begin to turn our attention more intensely toward Jesus' Passion, we cover up the crucifix. The sacred liturgy, however, frequently makes use of a strategy of revelation through veiling. Even though we cannot see the image of the Crucified, the veiling of the crucifix draws our attention to it more intensely. Frequently, what we can't see is what most arouses our curiosity and imagination.

UPDATES TO THE DIOCESAN LITURGICAL DIRECTIVES

On the **Solemnity of St. Joseph** (*March 19th*), the diocese has released **updates*** to our diocesan liturgical directives. These updates continue to be made in consultation with several infectious disease specialists. Working with these medical professionals and specialists, the diocese is seeking to ensure that our parishes are following the safest and most prudent practices as we gather for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. (*The full updates from the diocese are available for your review on our parish website.*)

The most notable update recognizes that "surface and water-borne transmission are not viewed as common means of viral spread." With this understanding, the diocese has stated that it is safe for parishes to return the use of hymnals and refill holy water fonts. Regarding our hymnals, they will be returned to the pews after Easter Day, as we have already prepared the majority of the individual-use handouts/missalettes for Holy Week and Easter Day. (Our hymnals do contain the weekend readings for Mass.)

Regarding holy water, we will refill our holy water fonts starting next weekend. Hand sanitizer will continue to be provided when you enter the church building. Two touch-less hand sanitizer stations will be outside of the Church entryway in the narthex. This will allow you to sanitize your hands before entering the Church and blessing yourself with holy water. We will also continue to provide individual holy water bottles (*and blessed salt containers*) in the narthex for use of these sacramentals in your homes.
