

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - February 9, 2020

Today, the Church celebrates the **5th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Prior to Pope St. Paul VI's revision of the liturgical calendar in 1969, this day was called **Septuagesima Sunday**. *Septuagesima* is the Latin word for "seventy" and this weekend means that we are only 70 days away from **Easter Sunday**. This and the next two weekends were traditionally observed as a time of intentional preparation, preparing for the coming of **Ash Wednesday** and the beginning of the Lenten season. As **Lent** is that period of forty days to excite in our hearts the spirit of the Christian vocation, it is not a season to enter into lightly and without preparation.

With the beginning of Lent only three weekends away (and in the spirit of *Septuagesima Sunday*), this is our opportunity to begin our Lenten preparations. Just as a builder would not rush into a project without first having blueprints or design ideas, so we should not rush into Lent without a plan. We even see this concept of preparation reflected in our readings today and in the coming weeks. As such, we are called to prayerfully discern how we will approach the coming Lenten season, using the Sacred Scriptures as our guide.

Each set of readings over the next three weeks offers us reminders of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. Our first readings, from the Old Testament, remind men of what God has commanded His holy people to do (*help those in need, act justly, and love neighbor as yourself*). Our second readings from St. Paul highlights how God's grace will strengthen and unite us in this outreach to others. And, finally, our Gospel readings exemplify how we, as Christians, have a responsibility by our faith and actions to strive towards righteousness.

Taking all of this together, we are challenged to be disciples of Jesus Christ in both word and deed. This coming Lent serves as a chance to renew this commitment and grow in desire for our Lord. May we use these next few weeks wisely to discern how we will approach this season. I'm excited to see what the Lord has in store for our parish this Lent!

Sacramentals - Blessed Salt and Holy Water

On the **Feast of the Epiphany**, we gave away **Epiphany Chalk**, which is a sacramental used to bless one's home. In the life of the Church, this is but one of many sacramentals available to us from Holy Church. This may raise the question: **What exactly is a sacramental?** As we know, a **Sacrament** is an outward sign instituted by Christ to produce grace in the soul. A **sacramental is** not a **Sacrament**, though sacramentals bear a great resemblance to and help remind us of the Sacraments.

A **sacramental** is a sacred sign (such as a prayer, an action, or an object) that signifies effects, particularly of a spiritual nature, which are obtained through the intercession of Holy Church. They are handed down to us through Holy Church and, so often, make use of everyday things (chalk, water, salt, etc...) to remind us of how Jesus uses even the most common of things to show forth His glory. As with the worship of Holy Church, these objects engage our bodily senses so that we may "present [even] our bodies as a living sacrifice" (Romans 12:1) to the Lord. Every part of us and every part of our lives is to be given over to God.


