

## SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 14, 2021

Entering into the **Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time** (February 13<sup>th</sup>/14<sup>th</sup>), we are making our final preparations for the beginning of **Lent**. Even as the snow continues to fall, **Lent** is meant to serve as the hopeful beginning of a spiritual springtime that leads to God's manifold grace blossoming forth on **Easter Sunday**. Over these *forty days of prayer*, *fasting*, *and almsgiving*, may we discern both what graces from this past year that we seek to make long-lasting in our lives and which practices we need to restore or add to our lives to receive the new gifts Christ wishes to share with us this year.

As we once again enter into this season of *fasting*, our lives are once again meant to mirror the *fasting* of the Church's liturgy. Throughout **Lent**, the liturgy itself is stripped bare and we *fast* from the simple beauty we often take for granted: There are no longer flowers surrounding the altar; The colorful vestments of the priest exclusively turn to violet, reflecting the penitential nature of the season; Our candlesticks and altar crucifix turn to wood to draw our minds to the noble simplicity of the season; Unbleached wax candles are used with these wooden candlesticks as the somber tones of unbleached wax harmonize with the mournful tone of the season; And, finally, neither the *Gloria* nor the *Alleluia* will pass from our lips again until we rejoice together at the **Easter Vigil**.

To begin our Lenten journey, <u>Mass on Ash Wednesday will be offered</u> at 7:00 a.m., Noon, and 7:00 p.m. As previously mentioned, there will be a change regarding how ashes are distributed at Mass. Following the guidance of the Vatican, ashes will be sprinkled upon the top of the head instead of being marked on the forehead. This practice, traditionally done in Europe, prevents unnecessary physical contact as a precaution during the ongoing pandemic.

The sprinkling of ashes over each individual also more clearly calls to mind the biblical practice of putting on sackcloth and ashes, such as seen in Nehemiah: "On the twenty-fourth day of this month, the Israelites gathered together while fasting and wearing sackcloth, their heads covered with dust." (Nehemiah 9:1) However the ashes might be received, the interior repentance expressed by this exterior act is at the heart of the action.\*

Throughout the Lenten Season, you are invited to join us every Friday evening for the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m., starting this Friday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. Join us either in-person or via live-stream on our parish Facebook page. In addition to this devotion, consider joining us for daily Mass throughout the week. Daily Masses are offered every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday at 8:00 a.m., Wednesday at 7:00 p.m., and Friday at 8:30 a.m. Throughout Lent, we will be adding an extra hour of Confession every Friday prior to Stations. Confessions are heard every Tuesday at 8:30-9:00 a.m., Wednesday at 6:00-6:45 p.m., Friday at 6:00-6:45 p.m., Satuday at 4:00-4:45 p.m., and by appointment.

\*A common question asked on **Ash Wednesday**: "May non-Catholics come forward to receive ashes?" The answer: "Yes." Ashes are <u>not</u> a Sacrament, but are a <u>sacramental</u> (like the Sign of the Cross). Receiving ashes does not signify a communion of faith beyond a need for repentance and a remembrance of our own mortality. All people of good will, acknowledging their need for repentance, are welcome and invited to come forward and "receive" ashes on **Ash Wednesday**.
