

### EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 27, 2022

This weekend (Feb. 26<sup>th</sup>/27<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Eighth Sunday** in Ordinary Time and is preparing to enter into the holy Season of Lent. This season, so rich in mystery, begins this Wednesday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>, with the celebration of Ash Wednesday and, after forty days, will lead us into the Sacred Paschal Triduum. Masses for Ash Wednesday will be offered at 7:00 AM, Noon, and 7:00 PM (with incense).

Please remember, **Ash Wednesday** (March 2<sup>nd</sup>) is a day of abstinence and fasting. On this day, we abstain from meat (as we will also do every Friday throughout **Lent**) and limit ourselves to one normal and two small meals throughout the day. (May we also join with Pope Francis and offer this day of fasting for world peace.) These biblical practices of fasting (Matthew 9:14-15) and abstinence (Daniel 10:2-3) strengthen our self-discipline and remind us of our true end, which is not here on earth but in heaven.

In addition to our personal Lenten observances that we discern to follow this year, the parish is offering a number of additional opportunities for prayer throughout Lent. This not only includes our regular weekday Mass, Adoration, and Confession schedules, but also a number of special Lenten offerings added to the schedule. Make sure to follow along with the **Parish Calendar** in the bulletin each weekend for a full schedule of these offerings.

Starting this Friday (*March* 4<sup>th</sup>), we will begin our weekly **Soup Suppers** from 5:30-6:30 PM in the Parish Social Hall and **Stations of the Cross** at 7 PM in the Church. On Saturday evening (*March* 5th), we will begin showing **The Chosen series** in the Parish Gym at 6:30 PM. Our diocesan **The Light is On For You** campaign will offer confession in every parish next Tuesday (March 8<sup>th</sup>) from 6-8 PM. Finally, we are in the final stages of planning our **Lenten Parish Mission** with more information to come soon.

### **DIOCESAN LITURGICAL UPDATES**

In addition to our county's declining COVID case-count and moving to "Yellow" this week, we've also received updated liturgical directives from the diocese for Lent. Following these directives, we will have two practices resume on Ash Wednesday: (1) Ashes will be distributed by tracing a cross on the forehead and (2) we will formally resume offering the communal Sign of Peace at all Masses. (When exchanging the Sign of Peace, please be mindful and respectful of those around you who may wish to continue limiting physical contact with others.) We will review our approach to our remaining prudential practices in the coming weeks.

### **DID YOU KNOW? CONFESSION TO A PRIEST**

Beginning first from a Scriptural perspective, we know that Jesus Himself forgave sins (cf. Matt. 9:6; Luke 5:17-26). He then gave His Church the authority to do likewise (cf. John 20:21-23). Finally, we know that the Church exercises this same authority in various ways (cf. Matt. 18:15-20; Luke 7:47; 1 Cor. 5:1-5; 2 Thess. 3:14-15; James 5:15-16; 1 Peter 4:8). In this understanding, we find the Sacrament of Confession.

We go to confession because it is a sacrament given to us by Christ and it has always been a practice of the Church. This sacrament reconciles us first with God and, secondly, with the Church. The priest, serving as a confessor, is not just "another human being," but one who acts *in persona Christi*, or "in the person of Christ." With faith, we believe that when the penitent speaks to the priest, the penitent speaks to Christ, and when the priest speaks, the priest speaks on behalf of Christ. When the priest says the words of absolution ("I absolve you"), truly, it is Christ who absolves.

As our sins offend not only God, but the whole Body of Christ, the priest also speaks *in persona ecclesia*, or "in the person of the Church." When we receive absolution from the priest, not only are we forgiven by God, but we are restored to the Body of Christ. We are restored to the new life of grace!

palms will be used at all Masses on Ash Wednesday, March 2nd. Mass times are - 7:00 a.m. / Noon / 7:00 p.m.






