For this is the offering of which the Lord has said, 'Everywhere and always bring me a sacrifice that is undefiled, for I am a great king, says the Lord."




St. Ignatius of Antioch Letter to the Philadelphians 4 (110 AD)

"Make certain, therefore, that you all observe one common Eucharist; for there is but one Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, and but one cup of union with his Blood, and one single altar of sacrifice... This will ensure that all your doings are in full accord with the will of God."

St. Cyprian of Carthage Epistle 63 - To Caecilius about the Eucharist (253 AD)

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – JANUARY 16, 2022

This weekend (January 15th/16th), the Church enters the **Second Sunday** in **Ordinary Time**. Entering into this new **Season of Ordinary Time**, our liturgical color, as reflected in both the priest's vestments and the chalice veil, returns to green. Green is a color that reflects growth. These next few weeks of **Ordinary Time** are meant to help us focus on growing in our relationship with Jesus Christ.

Though we enter a new season, our Gospel this weekend continues the theme of the **Epiphany**, or Jesus' manifestation to the world. In the Magi, Jesus is manifested to the Gentiles; In His Baptism, His divine sonship is manifested; In the Wedding Feast of Cana, we see the manifestation of His divine power and the beginning of His public ministry to the world. This continuation serves to remind us that, even as we enter into the ordinary and the everyday, Jesus Christ still touches every aspect of our lives.

DID YOU KNOW? THE CATHOLIC MASS IS ANCIENT

"At the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again, and so to entrust to his beloved Spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal banquet 'in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us." (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, Para. 47)

This explanation, proclaimed in the Second Vatican Council, shows forth the historical reality of the Mass. Instituted at the Last Supper by our Lord Jesus Christ, the same Mass has continued to be offered ever since. In every Mass, Jesus Himself is present, both in the person of His priest and under the accidents of bread and wine; In every Mass, His death becomes a present reality, offered as our sacrifice to God in an unbloody and sacramental way. As often as we assist at the Sacrifice of the Cross on the altar, the work of our redemption is carried on.

Though testified to at the Second Vatican Council, this understanding of the Mass is itself nothing new. Instead, it reflects the belief of the Church throughout the ages. Included in this bulletin is an insert from St. Justin Martyr, written in the middle of the 2nd Century. Speaking of the ancient practices of the Church, St. Justin is offering Antoninus Pius, the Roman Emperor, an explanation of the Christian Faith. This excerpt, focusing on Christian worship, describes the Mass itself.

The testimony of St. Justin Martyr, however, does not stand alone. The early Church Fathers throughout the ages have described and reflected upon the Church's timeless worship again and again. A small collection of these descriptions are seen on the bulletin cover this weekend. I encourage you to dive even deeper into these quotes and the writings of the Church Fathers. Through the witness of our ancestors, we find the Mass to be at the center of Christian worship since the very beginning of the Church Herself.

NATIONAL DAY OF PENANCE AND FASTING

This coming Saturday, January 22nd, our national Bishops' conference have called for a national day of penance and fasting for an end to abortion and the restoration of the legal right to life for the unborn. May we lift up our prayers for this cause and continue to work towards a protection of and an assistance for of all life.


