SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – FEBRUARY 13, 2022

This week (February 12th/13th), the Church celebrates the **Sixth Sunday** in **Ordinary Time**. This also means that we are just under three weeks away from **Ash Wednesday** and the beginning of our **Lenten season**. For your planning purposes, Masses will be offered on **Ash Wednesday** (March 2nd) at 7:00 **AM**, **Noon**, and 7:00 **PM**. (For those not yet able to join us in person, the 7:00 PM Ash Wednesday Mass will be live-streamed.)

Traditionally, this weekend was referred to as *Septuagesima Sunday*, marking a figurative "seventy days" until **Easter** and serving as a time of serious preparation for **Lent**. Though the penitential season of **Lent** itself had not yet begun, the Alleluia would be omitted prior to the Gospel and purple vestments were worn. These practices, however, were subdued with the introduction of **Ordinary Time** into the revised liturgical calendar.

Though Septuagesima Sunday has given way to Ordinary Time, the spirit of this preparatory period remains even still. This is reflected in our readings throughout these next three weekends, where each weekend highlights different aspects of the Christian life. In this way, we are challenged to discern where we are not fully living out a Christian life. And, in recognizing these areas, we begin thinking about how we will live and grow throughout the holy season of Lent.

DID YOU KNOW? THE SAINTS AND INTERCESSORY PRAYER

Similar to our devotion and relationship with the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Church has held dear to Her devotion and relationship with the Saints throughout the centuries. And, rightly so! The Saints are our brothers and sisters in Christ who now enjoy the Kingdom. They who have gone before us now support us along the way with their prayers and their friendship so that we too might one day join in the heavenly chorus, praising God together as one family for all eternity.

This relationship with the Saints again relies on a proper understanding of the difference between worship and prayer. Worship, in its truest sense, is adoration and is that which is given to God alone. Prayer, on the other hand, is a form of conversation and communication with another. In prayer, we can turn to God **and** to all those in union with Him. We adore God alone, but we can also give honor to and have a devotion towards those who are now with Him in Heaven for all eternity (who are known as the Saints).

Though the Saints have passed into eternity, they are not truly dead. As our Lord Himself reminds us, our God "is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive" (Luke 20:38). As members of the one Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:27), we remain united to those who have gone before even now. As St. Paul reminds us, nothing, not even death itself, can separate us in Christ (Romans 8:38-39).

As with the Blessed Virgin Mary, prayer to the Saints does not bypass Jesus Christ. Instead, we go to Him through the Saints, asking them in our prayer, or conversation, to bring our intentions before the throne of Jesus in Heaven. Just as we turn to and ask our loved ones on earth to pray for us (cf. 2 Thessalonians 3:1; Romans 15:30), so we also ask our heavenly brothers and sisters to pray for us as well. As St. James reminds us: "The fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful" (James 5:16).


