But if we deny Him, He will deny us. If we are unfaithful, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself."

Like the Apostle Paul, we are working out our salvation "with fear and trembling" (Philippians 2:12), with hopeful confidence in the promises made to us in Christ Jesus (cf. Romans 5:2; 2 Timothy 2:11-13).



#### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT – MARCH 20, 2022

This weekend, the Church celebrates the **Third Sunday of Lent**. We are nearing the halfway point of the Lenten season with the celebration of **Laetare Sunday** next weekend. This is, as always, a good opportunity to ensure that we are approaching this season with humility and an openness to God's will. If we feel that we are slipping in our Lenten observances, or fallen away from them completely, let us renew our efforts here and now.

May we always remember, as we learn from the Stations of the Cross, that our Lord Himself falls three times along the way to Calvary. Each time, however, He picks Himself up and continues His journey for our sake. In the same way, Jesus calls us to pick up the cross and carry along the way throughout this Lenten season. In doing so, we will find that everything we do this Lent will lead us to a greater love of God.

A special "*Thank You!*" to all those who helped with our **St. Joseph Table** for this weekend. Though we are not able to transfer the celebration of the **Solemnity of St. Joseph** to Sundays in Lent, we can still celebrate our parish patron in this little way. May St. Joseph, Foster-Father of our Lord and Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, continue to watch over the Body of Christ here on earth, the Church, in the same way that he watched over the Christ-Child at their home in Nazareth.

#### ACT OF CONSECRATION OF RUSSIA AND UKRAINE

Pope Francis will lead an Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25th, the *Solemnity of the Annunciation*, at 5:00 PM Roman time (12:00 PM EST). The Holy Father has invited all bishops the world over to join him in this act of consecration. Bishop Rhoades has, in turn, invited the priests of our diocese and all the Faithful to join together in this prayer for peace.

Given this request by Pope Francis and Bishop Rhoades, I invite all those who are able to join together this Friday, March 25th, at Noon in the Church as we pray for peace in Ukraine, Russia, and throughout the whole world. In addition to the consecratory prayers that may be offered, we will also join together in praying the Rosary.

#### **DID YOU KNOW? THE CHURCH AND SALVATION**

The Catholic Church views salvation as the forgiveness of sins and restoration of friendship with God. In this way, our salvation begins with our Baptism and, being our relationship with God, is a journey that will continue throughout our entire lifetime. For this reason, we often find the Sacred Scriptures speaking of salvation in the *past-tense* (cf. Ephesians 2:8–9), the *present-tense* (cf. Philippians 2:12), and the *future-tense* (cf. Romans 13:11; 1 Corinthians 3:15; 5:5).

We believe that salvation is the process by which we come closer to God throughout our whole life, in part by our participation in the Sacraments and the grace that comes through them. This does not mean, however, that man's salvation is based upon himself or his own action. God the Father planned our salvation. God the Son gained our salvation through His death and resurrection. God the Holy Spirit infused the very love of God into our hearts by His presence (cf. Romans 5:5). Salvation does not come from man's own action, but is instead a cooperation with God's grace throughout our lives as we seek eternal happiness with Him in heaven.

This cooperation is rooted in our faith in Jesus Christ (cf. Romans 10:9), which is essential to salvation. As the Sacred Scriptures profess, we must live out our faith through a life of obedience and good works (cf. James 2:17). Salvation is a process with many points of justification (*which is the renewal of our relationship with God*) along the path to heaven. Salvation prepares us, throughout our life, for heaven, where we will "share His holiness" (Hebrews 12:10) for all eternity. *~Faithfully in Christ, Fr. David*


