Ascension of the Lord

ASCENSION: the act of rising to a higher level

The Ascension of the Lord takes place forty days after the resurrection of Jesus (Easter).

Technically, this day falls on a Thursday, but the celebration is transferred to the following Sunday.

On this day, Jesus was taken up to Heaven in his resurrected body in the presence of his apostles.



BIBLICAL REFERENCES

• While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. Luke 24:51

2 So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God. Mark 16:19

Following the Ascension of the Lord, the Church awaits Pentecost Sunday, which falls fifty days after Easter and marks the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.

3 As the apostles were watching, Jesus was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Acts 1:9-11

The ascension is also professed in the Nicene Creed and in the Apostles' Creed: "He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father...

Jesus departs, he ascends to Heaven. He returns to the Father. But this does not mean a separation, for he remains forever with us, in a new way. By his ascension, the Risen Lord draws the gaze of the Apostles - and our gaze - to the heights of Heaven to show us that the end of our journey is the Father... Yet, Jesus remains present and active in the affairs of human history through the power and the gifts of his Spirit; he is beside each of us: **even if we** do not see him with our eyes, **He is there!** He accompanies us, he guides us, he takes us by the hand and he lifts us up when we fall down.... The Lord is with us!

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD - MAY 16, 2021

This past Thursday marked the *fortieth day* since **Easter Sunday**. This is traditionally when **Ascension Thursday** would be celebrated. In the United States, however, our national conference of Bishops has transferred this celebration from Thursday to this Sunday to make its solemn celebration as opportune as possible for the Faithful. Next weekend, marking *fifty days* since **Easter Sunday**, we will celebrate the **Solemnity of Pentecost**.

PENTECOST COLLECTION FOR THE EDUCATION OF SEMINARIANS

Next weekend, as we celebrate the **Solemnity of Pentecost**, we will also have our annual special collection for the education of our diocesan seminarians. Included as a handout in this bulletin is a letter from Bishop Rhoades regarding this annual collection. Similar to last year, each registered parish household will also receive a letter from our diocesan Director of Vocations, Fr. Andrew Budzinski. Fr. Budzinski shares the good problem that our diocese has consistently faced in recent years: We have many seminarians!

Next Saturday, Bishop Rhoades will ordain **two** men to the transitional diaconate. On June 6th, he will ordain **seven** men to the priesthood. We have another **20+** young men in various stages of discernment towards the priesthood. This is a very good problem to have! The annual Pentecost Collection helps to fund the education of these men as they study for the priesthood within our diocese. On behalf of our seminarians and future priests (*including those that will come from our own parish!*), thank you for your generosity.

UPCOMING PARISH EVENTS & OPPORTUNITIES

In the coming weeks, we have many exciting opportunities arising. Next weekend, Michelle from our Parish Office will be available after all Masses to update parish registry information and register any new families to our parish. Members of the **Knights of Columbus** and our newly named **Women's Group, G.I.R.L.'s Night Out** (*Growing, Inspiring, Rejoicing, Loving*), will also be available after all Masses to provide information about their respective groups.

Beginning on **Thursday**, **June 3rd**, we will be offering a **weekly Summer Bible Study**, entitled *Beginning with the End*. Meeting **every Thursday evening at 7 PM** in the **Parish Social Hall**, we will walk through the **Book of Revelation**. Over nine weeks, we will walk through this book, also known as the *Apocalypsis*, unpacking the extravagant symbolism found throughout this apocalyptic literature.

On Tuesday, June 8th, from 3:30-4:30 PM, we will host an informational session for Well-Read Moms (WRM), a nationwide network of local book clubs for women. For the past decade, WRM has sought to accompany and bring women together in the reading of spiritual classics. WRM is seeking to pilot book clubs in a parish-based setting throughout the country. All women in our parish and our surrounding community are invited to this session to learn more about this opportunity.

In July, we will be hosting **Totus Tuus** from July 11th-16th. **Totus Tuus** is a week-long Scriptural and catechetical program that has tracts for both our **1st-6th Graders** and our **7th-12th Graders**. Led by a group of college students and seminarians, this program seeks to teach the Catholic Faith and to ignite hearts on fire with the love of Jesus Christ.




