SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER / ASCENSION SUNDAY - MAY 29, 2022

This weekend, our nation observes **Memorial Day**. On this day, we thank God and pray for those who have made the ultimate sacrifice to defend our country's freedom. Join us for Mass this **Memorial Day** (Monday, May 30th) at 9 AM.

This weekend, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Ascension**. This celebration is meant to mark the *fortieth day* since **Easter Sunday** and points us toward Pentecost. Though our Lord Jesus has ascended to the right hand of the Father, He has not abandoned us. On **Pentecost**, the Lord sends forth the Holy Spirit to renew the face of the earth, vivify His Church, and remain ever with us.

"For our Parish Family" and Mass in the Summer

Each weekend, one of our repeated Mass intentions is offered for our "Parish Family." This summer, however, you will notice that this intention will generally not be listed among our weekend intentions. That is because, as I travel for the summer, this intention travels with me. This intention is formally known as the *Pro Populo Mass*, or the *Mass for the People*.

As pastor of St. Joseph, I have the responsibility, under Church law (Canon 534 §1), to offer a Mass for the people of our parish every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. As the Catechism states, the Mass is the highest form of prayer that we can offer (Catechism, Para. 1324). How appropriate it is, then, that the pastor frequently offers the Mass on behalf of those entrusted to his care.

Though I will be away from the parish for the summer, I remain the pastor of our parish and I retain this great responsibility to offer Mass on your behalf. This means that, every Sunday, wherever I might be, I will offer the *Pro Populo Mass* for our parish family. As priests are also strongly encouraged to (*and I, personally, believe should*) offer Mass everyday, I will offer my weekday Masses throughout this summer for many special intentions that I have been asked by others to pray for.

Entering into the summer months, it is important to remember that our attendance at Sunday Mass remains just as important during this time as at any other time throughout the year. If you are traveling any weekend this summer, you can find Mass times at **www.Masstimes.org** for churches throughout the world. Ensuring that we attend Mass, most especially when traveling on vacation, serves as a beautiful witness to how important the Mass is. It also allows us to experience the universality of the Church, seeing our Faith lived in various places.

VISITING PRIESTS AND SUMMER COVERAGE

As I leave this week for the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, we will welcome a number of priests to assist with Masses over the next three weekends. For daily Masses, priests from Decatur & Fort Wayne will be providing coverage each day. On **Saturday**, **June 4th**, we will welcome Msgr. Michael Heintz, Academic Dean of Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD, for our Vigil Mass. On **Sunday**, **June 5th**, Fr. Stephen Felicichia, parochial vicar at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, will preside at our morning Masses. The following weekend, we will welcome Fr. Bill Sullivan as the presider for our weekend Masses.

On **June 18th**, we will welcome Fr. John Sheehan, SJ, who will be in residence at the rectory for the remainder of the summer. Fr. Sheehan, a priest of the Society of Jesus (or Jesuits), currently serves as the chaplain at the University of St. Francis in Fort Wayne. Prior to this, he has had a wealth of experience, serving as a missionary for 12 years in Nigeria, 27 months in the South Pacific, and, most recently, three years in Amman, Jordan. Before entering the Jesuits, he worked in professional theatre and broadcasting.

As always, I thank you for the warm welcome you will give to our visiting priests throughout the summer. Over the next two months, I will be fairly focused on my studies, especially with the approaching oral comprehensive exam at the end of the summer. This means that I will not be regularly checking my office voicemail or parish email during the summer. If you need to reach me, please contact the Parish Office. Let us always keep each other in prayer and I look forward to being back at St. Joseph's in August. ~Faithfully in Christ, Fr. David
