## BAPTISM OF THE LORD - JANUARY 10, 2021

This weekend ( $Jan. 9^{th}/10^{th}$ ), the Church celebrates the **Baptism of the Lord**. This celebration will end the Christmas season and bring us into **Ordinary Time**. There will, however, be a brief resurgence of **Christmas** on the **Feast of the Presentation** ( $Feb. 2^{nd}$ ), which marks the fortieth day after Christmas Day. Following the Law of Moses (Leviticus 12:1-4), the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph would have presented Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after his birth (Luke 2:21-38).

Given how beautiful the church looks with our Christmas decorations, we will keep the Christmas trees in our sanctuary until this resurgence of Christmas joy on the **Feast of the Presentation** (Feb. 2<sup>nd</sup>). This not only allows us to enjoy the beauty of the church a bit longer, but is also a joyous reminder that we are called to keep the Incarnation of Jesus Christ alive in our hearts. The joy of the Incarnation is not meant to be isolated to only Christmas Day, but is to be celebrated each and every day of our lives! And how do we keep this celebration alive in our lives? Remembering the words of St. Teresa of Calcutta: "It is Christmas every time you let God love others through you."

As we move into **Ordinary Time** this Monday, we are challenged by this concept of time. So often, we want to be in control of our time and to use it as we will. The season of **Ordinary Time**, however, serves to reemind us that all time belongs to God. As the creator of the universe, all things, including time itself, belong to God. We ourselves are His! As we heard in our first reading, God has "formed us" and has given us a purpose (*Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7*). We are to use this time that God has given, every single moment of our lives, to imitate Him and show forth His love. This is why our time spent in worship is so important. Worship provides us with an opportunity to give thanks to God for all His gifts and to teach us how to love.

## PLANNING IN THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

At our Parish Council meeting this past week, we have begun to brainstorm ways to celebrate this new Year of St. Joseph as proclaimed by Pope Francis. As we enter into **Ordinary Time**, we will offer our weekly Wednesday evening 7:00 PM Mass as a special Votive Mass of St. Joseph whenever possible. This will occur every time that there is a ferial day on the Church calendar. A ferial day is any day within Ordinary Time when there is no special feast or memorial to be celebrated, e.g. there is no specific Saint's feast day celebrated on that calendar day.

On ferial days, we have the option to celebrate a special votive Mass, or a Mass celebrated for a special purpose. While the daily readings will remain the same, our prayers spoken in the liturgy, specifically the Opening Prayer (Collect), the Prayer over the Offerings, and the Prayer after Communion, will make special mention of our parish patron, St. Joseph. The "special purpose" of such a votive Mass is to increase our devotion to St. Joseph. (This is similar to our Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart celebrated on the First Friday of the month, meant to help increase our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.)

In addition to the votive Mass, we are also looking at other activities we can do as a parish. This includes the possibility of a weekly Novena to St. Joseph, a parish-wide consecration to St. Joseph, etc... More to come!
