A season of hope, preparation, expectation & celebration



The ADVENT WREATH is a popular symbol used as the focus of prayer throughout the season

Advent is made up of <u>four weeks</u> and divided into <u>two periods</u>:

1 First Sunday of Advent until December 16

Focus: Christ's second coming at the end of time

2 December 17 to 24

Focus: Preparing for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ

The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year

Through prayer, spiritual reading, acts of charity, and attending Mass, ADVENT helps us to expand the meaning of our lives, so that we are not ends in ourselves, but a people who seek Christ as our hopeful end and joyful fulfilment.

#### FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - NOVEMBER 29, 2020

It's beginning to look a lot like **Christmas**, even though **Advent** has only just begun! As we prepare our homes and our hearths for the coming **Christmas season**, let us never forget to prepare our hearts for Christ. These four weeks of **Advent** are meant to serve as a penitential and preparatory time. During this time, we await both the yearly celebration of the Nativity of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day and the *Parousia*, which is the second coming of Jesus Christ, at the end of time. Jesus Christ has come into the world and He will come again. The **season of Advent** is meant to both look backward at the Incarnation and forward to the second coming.

For this reason, our readings over the next four weeks will be broken into two sections. For **the first three weeks of Advent**, our readings focus first on the second coming of Jesus. These readings will call us to repentance and conversion, preparing our hearts to always be ready for Christ. For **the last eight days of Advent**, our readings will then focus on our celebration of Christmas Day itself. These readings will be taken from the infancy narratives of the Gospels of both Sts. Matthew and Luke, filling our hearts with expectant joy as we prepare to celebrate the Incarnation.

The penitential and preparatory themes of **Advent** are reflected not only in our readings, but throughout our whole liturgy. Over the next four weekends, we will not recite the *Gloria*, a prayer of joy, at Mass. Our altar crucifix and candlesticks have been replaced with our simple wooden crucifix and candlesticks with unbleached beeswax candles. The priest will wear violet vestments. Throughout **Advent**, even the Church's adornments and ornamentation take a muted tone. All of this is meant to help enter us into this spirit of preparation to receive for the Lord Jesus Himself (*Revelation 3:20*).

Our Advent preparation itself is one of great spiritual value. Jesus desires to grow within our soul. During Advent, I would encourage you to make use of the Sacrament of Confession. Within this sacrament, the mercy of God heals the wounds that sin has inflicted upon our soul. Through the healing of our woundedness, we are able to be more open to Jesus' love. Confessions are scheduled every Tuesday from 8:30 - 9:00 AM, Wednesday from 6:00 - 6:45 PM, and Saturday from 4:00 PM - 4:45 PM. Confessions are also always available by appointment.

Throughout **Advent**, we will also have several other opportunities to prepare our hearts for the coming of Jesus Christ. This includes the chance to participate in our **Advent Food Drive**, helping to provide for those in need within our community (*Matthew 25:35*). We will also have the opportunity for a brief "retreat" with our upcoming **Advent Parish Mission**. Mark your calendars and plan to attend, either in-person or live-stream, **each evening at 7 PM from Monday, Dec. 7th, through Wednesday, Dec. 9th**.

As we enter into our **Advent** preparations, we must also never lose sight of what (and who!) we are preparing for. All of this preparation is made so that we are prepared to rejoice as we celebrate the birth of our Savior. In the Church, times of preparation always gives way to the joy of Jesus Christ. As a part of our parish preparations, we want our parish campus to reflect the light of our joy throughout the **Christmas season**. I invite you to join us on **Saturday, Dec. 5th, at 9 AM** (following the 8 AM morning Mass) to help string **Christmas lights throughout our campus** that will be lit throughout the **Christmas season**. Many hands will make quick work of this project.
