#### SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT – DECEMBER 5, 2021

This Wednesday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, the Church celebrates our country's patronal feast: **The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception**. This day is a **Holy Day of Obligation**. To assist in fulfilling this obligation, **Masses for the Holy Day will be offered on Tuesday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, at 5:30 PM, and <b>Wednesday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 AM, Noon, and 7:00 PM** (with Choir).

This weekend (December 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>), the Church celebrates the **Second Sunday of Advent**. In our readings, we hear the theme of movement and conversion. In our first reading (Baruch 5:1-9), Baruch speaks of the end of the diaspora (*Israel's exile*) and the return of the Israelites to Jerusalem. Similarly, our responsorial psalm (Psalm 126) is a song rejoicing in the return from exile. Though they have returned, the journey had only begun in their desire to restore Jerusalem to its former glory.

In our second reading (Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11), St. Paul speaks to the Church in Philippi. This Roman town, occupied by both Gentiles and a small Jewish community, had embraced the Lord. Though he is imprisoned as he writes them, he rejoices with those in Philippi about the great growth the Church had seen. As great as the growth had been, he prays that their relationship with and their conversion in Christ continues to deepen.

Finally, this call is echoed again in our Gospel (Luke 3:1-6) as St. John the Baptist calls all people to repentance. Israel responds to his call as those from within and without the cities go out into the desert to encounter him. John, though, is only preparing the way for something (*someone*) greater: Jesus Christ. The best gift that we can give to Jesus this Christmas is the gift of our conversion. And, the best way for us to receive this gift from Jesus is in the sacramental form in which He wishes to give it: Confession.

#### ADVENT MISSION AND PENANCE SERVICE

Mark your calendar! Our Advent Parish Mission will be hosted from Monday, December 20<sup>th</sup>, through Wednesday, December 22<sup>nd</sup>, at 7 PM each evening. We will welcome a different speaker to lead each evening, hearing from Fr. Stephen Felichia (*St. Elizabeth Ann Seton*), Fr. Dan Koehl (*St. Charles Borromeo*), and Fr. Eric Burgener (*St. Vincent de Paul and Chaplain to Parkview Hospital*).

On Tuesday, December 21<sup>st</sup>, our Parish Mission (7 PM) will lead into our Parish Penance Service (~7:30 PM), where we will have several priests available to hear Confessions. Our Parish Mission will conclude at our evening 7 PM Mass on Wednesday, December 22<sup>nd</sup>, with Fr. Eric Burgener serving as our primary celebrant and homilist. The Parish Mission will also be available via live-stream.

"HAIL, FULL OF GRACE! THE LORD IS WITH YOU."

Luke 1:28

In the Gospel of St. Luke, the Archangel St. Gabriel greets the Blessed Virgin Mary by crying out "Hail, full of grace!" (Luke 1:28). This greeting is no ordinary greeting. St. Gabriel does not call the Blessed Virgin by her given name, which, in Hebrew, is פּיִרְתּמ or Miryam (Mary). Instead, the archangel refers to her by a new name: Full of grace. In the Greek manuscript of the Gospel, this name is conveyed by the Greek word κεχαριτωμένη (kecharitomene).

This new name given to Mary by the archangel is found only in this single verse throughout the entirety of the Sacred Scriptures. To be given a new name communicates something that is permanent about the character of the one who is named. This is seen throughout the Old Testament, such as when Abram becomes Abraham (Genesis 17:5), Sarai becomes Sarah (Genesis 17:15), and Jacob becomes Israel (Genesis 32:28). To understand this significance in relation to Mary, we must look to the name itself as it has been given.

What is this action? This action is the act of Mary being filled with God's grace from the very moment of her conception and remaining full of His grace throughout her entire life. Therefore, when Mary is referred to as kecharitomene, it means that she is one who is and has always been full of God's grace. The archangel uses this word as an adjective referring to Mary. For Mary, being full of grace is not simply an action, but expresses her very identity. Before she was the Mother of God [theotokos] (Luke 1:43), before she was Mother of the Church [mater ecclesiae] (John 19:27), she was, from her very beginning, kecharitomene, or "full of grace" (Luke 1:28).

Mary received this great gift as a result of that "singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race." This understanding, as with all things Marian, points us to her Son, Jesus Christ.

Bernadette relates: I saw a lady dressed in white, she wore a white dress, an equally white veil, a blue belt and a yellow rose on each foot.



Bernadette made the Sign of the Cross and said the Rosary with the lady. When the prayer ended the Lady suddenly vanished.

# Feb 18

For the first time, the Lady spoke.



Bernadette held out a pen and paper asking her to write her name.

Our Lady: It is not necessary.

Our Lady: Would you be kind enough to come here for a fortnight?

I do not promise to make you happy in this world but in the other.

## Feb 25

Bernadette relates: She told me to go, drink of the spring. I only found a little muddy water. At the fourth attempt I was able to drink. She also made me eat the bitter herbs that were found near the spring, and then the vision left.

he apparitions at Lourdes took place only four years after the proclamation of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, in 1854, and given their nature it is only natural to see a strong link between the two.

On 11 February 1858, fourteen

On 11 February 1858, fourteen year old Bernadette Soubirous saw a beautiful young girl in a niche at a rocky outcrop called Massabielle, about a half mile outside the town. This was the beginning of a whole sequence of apparitions, 18 in all, which occurred during the spring and early summer of 1858.



St. Bernadette refers to the vision as 'Aquero', which means, 'this thing', and said that the Lady spoke in the Lourdes dialect.

#### March 2

Our Lady: Go, tell the priests to come here in procession and to build a chapel here.

Bernadette spoke of this to Fr. Peyramale, the Parish Priest of Lourdes.



Fr. Peyramale: If the Lady really wishes that a chapel be built, then she must tell us her name and make the rose bush bloom at the Grotto in the middle of winter.

#### ■ 14th-15th Apparition

# March 3, 4

The crowd becomes larger and larger (about 8,000). Soldiers and police had been put on duty to control the expected large crowd.

Bernadette: Would you kindly tell me who you are?

The vision response was a smile.

#### ■ 16th Apparition

# March 25

The Lady finally revealed her name.

Our Lady: I am the Immaculate Conception.

Bernadette left and, running all the way, repeated continuously the words that she did not understand.

These words troubled the Parish Priest.

Four years earlier, in 1854, the Church declared that Mary was the "Immaculate Conception".

The title would certainly have been unknown to Bernadette since it was not broadly discussed in the liturgy at that time.

"She could never have invented this ... " wrote Fr. Peyramale to the bishop that evening.




