CONFESSION



BEFORE YOU GO

Examine your conscience, that is, reflect on what sins you have committed. To guide you, just Google "examination of conscience" and you'll find resources to help you. It's even all right to make a list to bring with you if that helps.



INTRODUCTION

When you come before the priest, begin by making the Sign of the Cross (praying the words out loud), and continue by saying, "Bless me, Father, I have sinned. It has been (how long) since my last confession. These are my sins..."



CONFESSION

List the sins you've committed that came to mind during your examination of conscience. Don't be too general ("I haven't been a good person"), but a lot of detail isn't necessary (you don't need to tell the whole story of how a sin came about). If you're not sure if something is a sin, ask the priest. This isn't counseling, so unless you ask, the priest likely won't give you advice. He'll just move on to ...



PENANCE

The priest will suggest something for you to do or pray as a response to God's mercy. You'll have to remember what this is and do it after the confession is over, so pay attention.



ACT OF CONTRITION

The priest will then ask you to pray out loud your "Act of Contrition," to demonstrate your sorrow for your sins: "My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy."



ABSOLUTION

Don't get up to leave after that prayer, because the best part is yet to come: The priest will extend his hands in your direction and he will pray the Prayer of Absolution: "God, the Father of Mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son, has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins. Through the ministry of the Church, may God grant you pardon and peace. And I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." You respond: "Amen."



CONCLUSION

The priest will then likely say something like, "God has freed you from your sin. Go in Peace." To which you can respond: "Thanks be to God." Don't forget to do your penance. If it is saying certain prayers, it's best to do it right away in the church before you forget.

CATECHISM CORNER

What is Confession?

Confession is the Sacrament by which sins committed after Baptism are forgiven through the absolution of the priest.

How can a priest forgive sins?

Only God can forgive sins and He can decide how He does so. The way He has decided upon is to use His priests as His instruments.

The priest has the power to forgive sins from Jesus, who said to His Apostles and their successors in the priesthood: "Who sins you shall forgive are forgiven them."

Is it necessary to confess every sin we have committed?

It is necessary to confess every
mortal sin which has not yet
been confessed and forgiven;
It is not necessary to confess
our venial sins, but it can be
helpful to do so.

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, NOVEMBER 8, 2020

This weekend, Bishop Rhoades has a very pertinent article in the *Today's Catholic*, our diocesan newspaper, entitled "*Keeping Sunday Holy During the Pandemic*." In it, he offers a variety of suggestions (*including attending Mass, either in-person or online, reading the Sacred Scriptures, praying the Rosary as a family, refraining from unnecessary work, etc...) on how we can ensure that Sunday does not simply become any other day of the week. He concludes by reminding us how we need Sunday "as a day to worship God, to rest and to celebrate joyfully our salvation in Christ. We need to be renewed by the weekly commemoration of Easter."*

Written specifically for this 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time (*Nov.* 7/8), Bishop offers these suggestions as a reflection on his continuation of the dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation for the foreseeable future. As he states, "this dispensation is in effect particularly for the protection of those most vulnerable to serious, life-threatening risks if they were to be infected" by COVID-19 and for their caregivers. Though our entire parish family may not yet be able to fully gather together in person, we want to do all that we can to ensure that we do not remain complacent in our personal relationship with the Lord, but continue to deepen this relationship.

Bishop does share the good news that, thanks to our diocesan safety precautions, there have been no known large-scale instances of any virus-spread in our 81 Catholic churches throughout the diocese. Because of this, all parishes in our diocese will continue to follow our given diocesan safety precautions. As a reminder, these precautions include: (1) Following proper social distancing guidelines; (2) Wearing a face-mask or face-covering when in the Church (excluding infants, small children, and those who would have trouble breathing if they were to wear a face-mask); (3) Utilizing the provided hand-sanitizing stations in the Church; (4) Sanitizing pews after each use; and (5) our continued temporary suspension on congregational singing.

As always, thank you for your patience and understanding as we strive to offer Mass while respecting the safety precautions put into place by our Bishop. As I mentioned in March, while we might have a variety of personal opinions regarding these safety precautions, these are given as a request from our Bishop. Bishop Rhoades, as the successor to the Apostles for our diocese and our diocesan spiritual father, requests that we continue to follow these precautions as we gather for Mass. **Thank you, out of respect for Bishop, for following these precautions**. (We will continue to ensure that disposable masks are available in the narthex for visitors and those who may have forgotten their masks at all weekend Masses.)
