Epiphany HOME Blessing

"Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

After Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, the Holy Family was visited by three Magi from the east. They came to worship Christ and bring him gifts of gold (the gift for a king), frankincense (the gift for a priest), and myrrh (a burial ointment, the gift for one who would die).

The Feast of Epiphany is celebrated on the 12th Day of Christmas, January 6th, but in the United States is moved to the Sunday between January 2nd-8th.

On the Feast of the Epiphany, it is traditional for families to bless their homes, remembering the hospitality of the Holy Family to the Wise Men and asking for protection and blessing on their family home and all who enter there.

The home blessing is done by writing on the door or door frame with chalk the symbols 20+C+M+B+21. The 20 and 21 represent the current year, 2021. The + reminds us of the cross on which our Savior died. The C, M, and B stand for the traditional names of the Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar, as well as an abbreviation for the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house." Writing on the door also brings to mind the Passover of the Jews during the final plague in Exodus, when the blood of the lamb protected the inhabitants within.

"In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations."

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - JANUARY 3, 2021

While this weekend (Jan. 2nd/3rd) helps to bring us into the New Year, the Church celebrates the Epiphany of the Lord this weekend. Though this solemnity marks the 12th Day of Christmas (Jan. 6th), its celebration has been transferred by our Bishops' Conference to the nearest Sunday. The word itself (*Epiphany*) comes from the ancient Greek word *epipháneia*, which is a noun and means "manifestation." This celebration continues our Christmas celebration as it refers to three manifestations of Jesus Christ to the world: The Adoration of the Magi, the Baptism of the Lord, and the Wedding Feast at Cana.

The Adoration of the Magi, or the Feast of the Three Kings, recalls the Magi (from the Greek noun "magoi") coming from the East. Most likely, the Magi were Persian priest-astrologers. Having studied the stars and known of the Jews hope of a Messiah, they are seeking out this newborn King of the Jews. This becomes the first manifestation of Jesus to the Gentiles. Similarly, in the **Baptism of the Lord**, the heavens are opened as the voice of the Father cries out and the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove, descends upon the Son of God. In this act, Jesus' divinity (and our Triune God) are made manifest to Israel (John 1:31).

Finally, at the Wedding Feast at Cana, our Lord's miraculous turning of water into wine manifests the beginnings of His public ministry. This is the "beginning of miracles" by which He "manifested his glory, and his disciples believed in him" (John 2:11). In these three events, we see Jesus Christ made known to the world. As expressed by Dom Gueranger, writting in his 19th Century tome The Liturgical Year: "Let us imitate the faith and obedience of the Magi; Let us adore, with the holy Baptist, the divine Lamb, over whom the heavens open; Let us take our place at the mystic feast of Cana, where our dear King is present, thrice manifested, thrice glorified."

For your planning purposes, our **January Discussion Forum** will be a "Teaching Mass" offered both next Sunday, Jan. 10th, from 8:30 AM -9:30 AM, and next Wednesday, Jan. 13th, from 7:30 PM - 8:30 PM. Please note, a "Teaching Mass" is not a Mass; Instead, it is a walkthrough of the Mass that looks at the various prayers, items, and traditions found throughout our liturgy. Given the nature of the discussion, this forum will take place in the Church, not the Parish Social Hall.

Thank you for your prayers, well-wishes, and generosity during my period of voluntary quarantine. Our good Lord used this opportunity to remind me of how truly blessed I am to be with you here at St. Joseph. Let us continue to pray, especially during this Christmastide, in a special way for all those suffering from the Coronavirus (and all illnesses), that they might know our Incarnate Lord's healing and love.

Thankfully, as I remained in good health throughout the entire period of quarantine, I had the opportunity to spend much time in prayer and with spiritual reading. Currently, I have been reading The Incarnation, Birth and Infancy of Jesus Christ by St. Alphonsius Liguori, which offers daily reflections for each day of Christmastide. If you are looking for a good spiritual book during this time, I would greatly recommend this classic.
