FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 7, 2021

As the Church celebrates the **Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time** this weekend (February 6th/7th), we draw even closer to the beginning of our Lenten season. Prior to Pope St. Paul VI's primary revision of the liturgical calendar in 1969, the three weekends leading up to **Ash Wednesday** were known as **Shrovetide**. During this time, the Faithful would begin their preparations for the coming Lenten season through serious discernment.

This discernment would serve to determine how to best approach **Lent** through our Lenten observances. In these observances, which are based in prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we strive to move closer to the Lord. In the words of Venerable Fulton Sheen: "Lenten practices of giving up pleasures are good reminders that the purpose of life is not pleasure." Instead, the purpose of life is union with God. And, throughout **Lent**, we are reminded that if we wish to share in the triumph of Jesus' Resurrection, we must first follow Him in the Way of the Cross.

Historically, this time of discernment also included a time of celebration. These celebrations, such as *Carnival* and *Mardi Gras*, often served two purposes, one practical and one spiritual. Practically, these celebrations served as a time to "clean" the pantry of those items that would be forgone during **Lent** and would otherwise spoil or be wasted. (*This, of course, is less of an issue with modern refrigeration and preservation techniques.*) Spiritually, they served as a reminder of what **Lent** points us toward, the celebration of **Easter** and the joy of the Resurrection. All the penitential practices of this life are always meant to give way to the joy of eternity.

Entering into this **Lent**, we will offer three Masses for **Ash Wednesday** (February 17th) at 7 AM, Noon, and 7 PM. As previously mentioned, when you approach to receive ashes, the ashes will be sprinkled over your head (differing from our customary practice of having ashes imposed upon the forehead by the priest's thumb). This change, requested by the Vatican, will help to limit unnecessary contact during the ongoing pandemic.

Starting on Friday, February 19th, we will offer Stations of the Cross every Lenten Friday at 7 PM in the Church. For those who cannot yet join us in person, Stations will also be live-streamed at the same time via our Facebook page. Following our diocesan guidelines for gatherings and after consulting with our Parish Council, we will not be offering our customary Lenten Soup Supper prior to Stations at this time.

In addition to **Stations of the Cross**, our weekly Confession times will continue: **Tuesdays at 8:30-9:00 AM; Wednesdays at 6:00-6:45 PM; Saturdays at 4:00-4:45 PM; Anytime by Appointment**. In addition to these weekly times, we will be adding even more times throughout Lent to ensure that the Sacrament is as available as possible. (*Confessions continue to be heard in the back children's room to allow for social distancing*.)

Finally, we are working to schedule a **Lenten Parish Mission**, which will follow the same format as our past Advent Mission. More information to come. May we make this the best **Lent** ever!

ST. JOSEPH BOLIVIAN MISSION PROGRAM

The Bolivian Mission Program was established here at St. Joseph's in 1985! For 36 years we have consistently sponsored 55 students with scholarships to attend Santa Maria Mazzarello School in Bolivia. Because the parents are not always able to pay for their children to attend school, these scholarships help with the cost of tuition, school supplies and more. Some students have furthered their education by becoming professionals enabling them to help their parents financially and also give back to the poor communities they grew up in. At the end of the school year, the children will send letters here to St. Joseph's along with a picture of themselves to show gratitude for the opportunity to attend school because of the generous gift given to them. After someone has translated the letters, we send them to their respective sponsor. Sadly some of our sponsors have moved or passed away leaving several openings needing to be filled. If you are interested in sponsoring a child or children, please call the parish office 824-1380 or Sue Singer at 824-8009. Their school year begins in February and concludes in October. Scholarships are \$90 (\$10/month for 9 months) per child, plus an optional Christmas donation. You may pay by the month, for the year or anywhere in between.
