#### THE REIGNING CHRIST

This image of Christ, the King, and the symbolism are taken from St. John's Book of Revelation. He wears His emblems of Prophet, Priest and King. He holds seven stars in His hand and His feet rest on the Book of the Seven Seals. The Alpha and Omega flank his head. Seven burning candles appear before His throne with the palms of His victory at the sides. Below is the tomb of the holy martyrs, who are the first to be raised on the last Day.

"The one who holds the seven stars in his right hand and walks in the midst of the seven gold lampstands." Rev. 2:1



#### THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME November 24, 2019

Join us for Mass on Thanksgiving Day on Thursday, Nov. 28th, at 9 AM. Come and begin your day with the Eucharist (Greek for Thanksgiving) as we give thanks to God from whom comes all our blessings.

Today, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**. Established by Pope Pius XI in his encyclical *Quas Primas* following the First World War, this yearly feast day is meant to ensure "that the kingship of our Savior should be as widely as possible recognized... [and] hasten the return of society to our loving Savior." We need Jesus Christ in every aspect of our lives. "Once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony." Jesus is meant not only to rule over our society, our country, and our Church, but also **our hearts**. May we strive everyday of our lives "to be worthy, faithful, and obedient subjects of the Divine King" who reigns eternally and invites us into relationship with Himself.

This solemnity also marks the end of our liturgical year. As we walk along the life of our Blessed Lord anew each year, we are reminded that all things begin and end in Christ. Throughout this past year, we have walked together through the Gospel of St. Luke. Directed towards a Gentile audience, St. Luke focused his gospel on Jesus as the Son of Man. Entering into our new liturgical year, we will now hear from the Gospel of St. Matthew. St. Matthew writes his gospels directed towards a Jewish audience and, as such, will focus on Jesus as the King of Israel. We will begin to walk with our Blessed Lord in St. Matthew's Gospel starting next weekend as we begin the Church

year anew on the First Sunday of Advent.

Advent is the beginning of our new liturgical year and serves as our time to prepare for Christ's coming (or, better yet, to allow Christ to prepare our hearts for His coming). We prepare both to celebrate His Incarnation, that historical day when the Word was made flesh, and His future coming in glory at the end of time. These two celebrations will be reflected throughout our Advent readings. The first two weekends of Advent, our readings focus on the second coming of Christ. Then, from December 17th to 24th, our readings prepare us to commemorate His first coming on Christmas Day.

As a time of preparation, Advent, though brief, is a penitential season. This is reflected in our very liturgy itself as our Church decorations and music take on a simpler tone. As in Lent, the Priest wears violet vestments as violet is a penitential and mournful liturgical color. One additional change we will introduce this Advent in our liturgical decoration is the use of wooden candlesticks and matching altar crucifix on our altar to help us better enter into the noble simplicity of this season. Our beautiful metal candlesticks and matching altar crucifix (from the original church on Cherry Street) will return to us on Christmas Day as all things join together to rejoice in the Good News of Jesus Christ entering the world. (A special "Thank You!" to our master craftsman, Joe Bauer, for his dedicated work in crafting these new candlesticks.) As always in liturgy (and in life!), all things should serve to point us to Christ.

I invite you as we prepare to began this Advent season to use the coming weeks to enter more deeply into the mystery of our Lord. As hectic as time of year can be, we must not lose sight of the true reason for the season. Instead, let us deepen our relationship with the Lord. What are some practical ways to do this? Commit to attending one daily Mass each week. Stop in the Church throughout the week for time in prayer. Meditate upon the Scriptures for fifteen minutes everyday. Take home and follow in the Little Blue Book the parish provides every year. Join in our Advent Bible Study, that will begin next Saturday, Nov. 30th, at 8:45 AM (following the 8 AM daily Mass) in the Parish Conference Room. Incorporate Advent into our home lives, joining in daily prayer at home through the use of an Advent Wreath, a Jesse Tree, or an Advent Calendar.

As mentioned last week, we will be starting a monthly Young Adult (ages 18-40) gathering here at the parish. The evening will offer a light dinner (BYOB), a short discussion on the Faith, and a chance to socialize (similar to the *Theology on Tap* model). Our first gathering will be on Sunday, Dec. 15<sup>th</sup>, from 5-6 PM in the Parish Social Hall. Free childcare will be offered. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Narthex starting next weekend.


