
THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD * CHRISTMAS - DECEMBER 25, 2022

Merry Christmas! Whether you are a longtime parishioner or a visiting guest, we are so happy that you have joined us this weekend to celebrate the **Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ**. May the Lord fill your hearts with the joy of His peace and love as we continue celebrating the birth of the Christ-child!

There are always so many people to thank for helping make our celebration of the Nativity of the Lord so beautiful: Our choirs who practiced for months to help us lift our hearts to the Lord, our church decorators, our altar servers who inspire us with their reverence, our parish staff (*Michelle, Teresa, and Stacey*), and all those who helped in anyway over these past many days.

We are also particularly grateful to you for choosing to celebrate with us! It is always great to welcome so many guests and to see old friends back home for the holidays. If it's your first time here at St. Joseph's with us, we would love to welcome you back soon, throughout the Christmas season and beyond!

Continuing with our liturgical year's focus on prayer as summarized by the passage from St. Luke's Gospel of "Lord, Teach Us to Pray," our parish Christmas gift for all families this year is St. Francis de Sales' spiritual classic: An Introduction to the Devout Life. This gift is available for all of our parish households (and visiting guests) in the Narthex this weekend.



Born in 1567 to an old aristocrat family, St. Francis de Sales was the eldest of his twelve siblings. Though his father desired that he take on a career within the political life of the day, St. Francis instead felt the call to the priesthood. After a number of years, he eventually gained his father's approval and began formation for priesthood.

After his ordination, St. Francis would eventually become known for his missionary activity, his spiritual writings, and would be named as the Bishop of Geneva (in modern-day France). He served faithfully in this role for over two decades. Following his death in 1622, he was canonized (*or recognized as a Saint*) in 1665. His writings, including *An Introduction to the Devout Life*, have been seen as such timeless spiritual works that St. Francis was named as a Doctor of the Church in 1877.

An Introduction to the Devout Life is a book to be read with pencil in hand. It is a book to be read again and again. Its aim is to help rid the reader of sin and even the inclinations to sin. No one will come away from this work without being profoundly impressed and without being motivated to enter upon the devout life, which leads ultimately to God and Heaven. May this classic serve to deepen our relationship with the Lord and bring us closer to Heaven.






LIFE DEFENDERS WORKSHOP
