Welcome to all those joining us this weekend (December 24th-26th) as the Church celebrates both the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ (December 24th/25th) and the Feast of the Holy Family (December 26th)! May the Lord fill your hearts with the joy of His peace and love as we continue to celebrate the birth of the Christ-child.

And, truly, this celebration does continue! The joy of the Incarnation cannot be contained by a single day. For this reason, Christmas is not simply a day, but a **season**! Though the world may quickly move on towards the next holiday, may we continue to celebrate these Twelve Days of Christmas with great festivity for this is a time of great rejoicing: **Salvation Himself has come into the world for you and for me!**

As you leave Mass this weekend, we invite you to take with you a wrapped present from the narthex. This is a gift on behalf of the parish to each of you! Each package includes the latest daily devotional from Matthew Kelly's *Dynamic Catholic* and a book from Gus Lloyd's **A Minute** in the Church series.

This year's daily devotion is: **The Wisdom of Fulton Sheen: 365 Days of Inspiration**. Venerable Fulton Sheen was one of the most well-known Catholic voices throughout the 20th Century, hosting "Life is Worth Living," a popular radio and television series. Born in Peoria, IL, Bishop Sheen was a priest of the Diocese of Peoria before becoming an auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of New York and, eventually, the Bishop of Rochester. This devotional offers daily meditations to carry us throughout the coming year.

Gus Lloyd is the host of the radio show, *Seize the Day!*, on the Catholic Channel. His series, **A Minute in the Church**, offers short explanations to a variety of questions about the Catholic Faith. **A Minute in the Church** is a five-part series. Each gift package contains one volume. After you finish your volume, we encourage you to exchange it with others from the parish so that you have a chance to read the whole five-part series.

A special "Thank You!" to all those who worked so hard to ensure our Christmas Liturgies were beautiful! Our Decorating Committee did superb work in preparing the Church for these holy days. Our Knights of Columbus helped to prepare our parish campus to shine throughout the Christmas season. 




