

Eucharistic Miracle of

O'CEBREIRO

SPAIN, 1300 AD



In the Eucharistic Miracle of O'Cebreiro, during the Mass, the Host that changed to Flesh and the wine to Blood was expelled from the chalice and stained corporal.

The Lord performed this prodigy in order to sustain the little faith of the priest that did not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. To this day, the sacred relics of the miracle are guarded near the church where this prodigy took place and numerous pilgrims go there annually to give them praise.



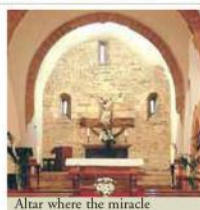

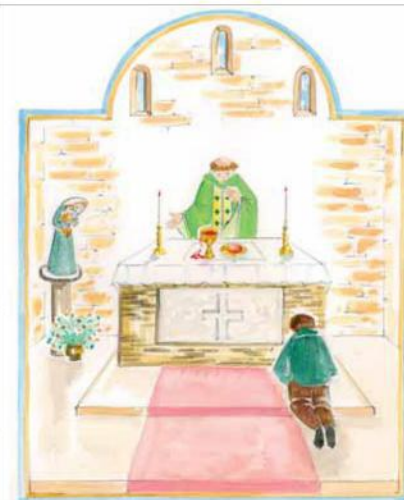

One icy night in AD 1300, a Benedictine priest was celebrating Mass in a chapel beside the convent of O'Cebreiro. Given the unceasing snow and freezing winds, he thought that no one would dare show up for Mass. He was, however, wrong. A farmer from Barxamaior, Juan Santín, came for Mass. The priest, who did not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, despised in his heart that the farmer came for Mass. During Mass, immediately after having professed the words of the consecration, the Host became true human flesh and the wine blood. Shaken by this miracle, the priest spilled some of the Precious Blood from the chalice and stained the corporal. The Lord had wanted to open the eyes of this incredulous priest who had doubted while rewarding the farmer for his great devotion.

For almost two hundred years, the Host, now real flesh, was left on a paten and the Blood in the chalice. Queen Isabella, however, learned about this miracle when she passed through O'Cebreiro while on pilgrimage and had a crystal reliquary custom made to hold the Host and the chalice. The reliquary can still be seen and visited to this day.

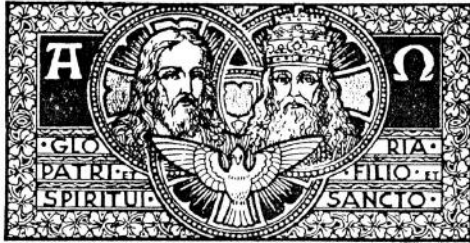

HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY – JUNE 12, 2022

Our daily Mass time will be 11:15 AM this Monday-Friday (June 13th-17th) to accommodate our Totus Tuus Summer Program and our visiting priests.

A special "Thank You!" to Fr. Bill Sullivan for serving as our celebrant at all Masses this weekend. Next weekend, we will welcome Fr. John Sheehan, who will be with us for the remainder of the summer.

This weekend, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity**. Though the **Easter season** has come to a close and we've entered back into **Ordinary Time**, we will continue to wear white vestments both this and next weekend (**Solemnity of Corpus Christi**) as a sign of joy. These two solemnities (**Most Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi**) that we celebrate naturally follow from **Pentecost Sunday**.

Following the descent of the Holy Spirit on **Pentecost**, we, just like the Apostles, are now sent out to the world. In the words of Abbot Rupert from the early 12th Century, how fitting it is that, today, we "*sing the glory of the Holy Trinity. For, after the coming of that same Holy Spirit, the faith in and confession of the name of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit immediately began to be preached, and believed, and celebrated, in Baptism.*" May we never be afraid to witness to the glory and love of our Triune God!

PARISH COUNCIL NOMINATIONS

Last year, we introduced three-year terms for members of our Parish Council to help ensure that our Parish Council has the widest representation of our parish as possible. This year, Nancy Wagner and Barb Ault will be cycling off of the Parish Council. We thank them for their years of dedicated service to our Parish Council and for being great stewards in helping to guide the direction of our parish.

In the next few weeks, we will take nominations to fill these two vacancies for our Parish Council. Parish Council Members serve three year terms and are asked to attend a monthly meeting from August through May. Meetings are the first Wednesdays of the month after the 7 PM evening Mass. The Parish Council serves as one of the main instruments that assists me as pastor in determining and guiding the direction of our parish.

I would ask that you prayerfully discern if God is calling you or if you feel He might be calling another to sit on our Parish Council. Nomination sheets will be included in the bulletin in the coming weeks where you can nominate yourself or other parishioners. Once nominations have occurred, I will "draw lots" to select our two new Parish Council Members.

THREE NEWLY ORDAINED PRIESTS

Last Saturday, our Diocese celebrated the ordination of three new priests: Fr. Brian Isenbarger, Fr. LeeAllen Fortin, and Fr. Mark Hellinger. For assignments, Fr. Isenbarger will serve as the parochial vicar of St. Vincent de Paul in Fort Wayne, Fr. Fortin as the parochial vicar of St. Mary's in nearby Decatur, and Fr. Hellinger will return to Rome for an additional year of schooling. Thank you for your support of the Pentecost Collection last weekend, which helps support the education of our future priests.

May we continue praying fervently for the men in formation for the priesthood and for an increase in priestly vocations especially in our own diocese and from our own parish.

(Growing, Inspiring, Rejoicing, Loving)

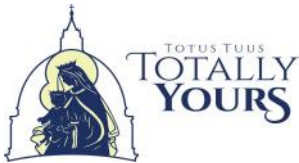

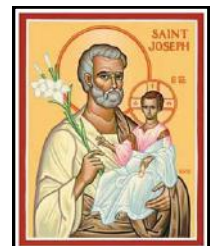
