



Eucharistic Miracle of TIXTLA

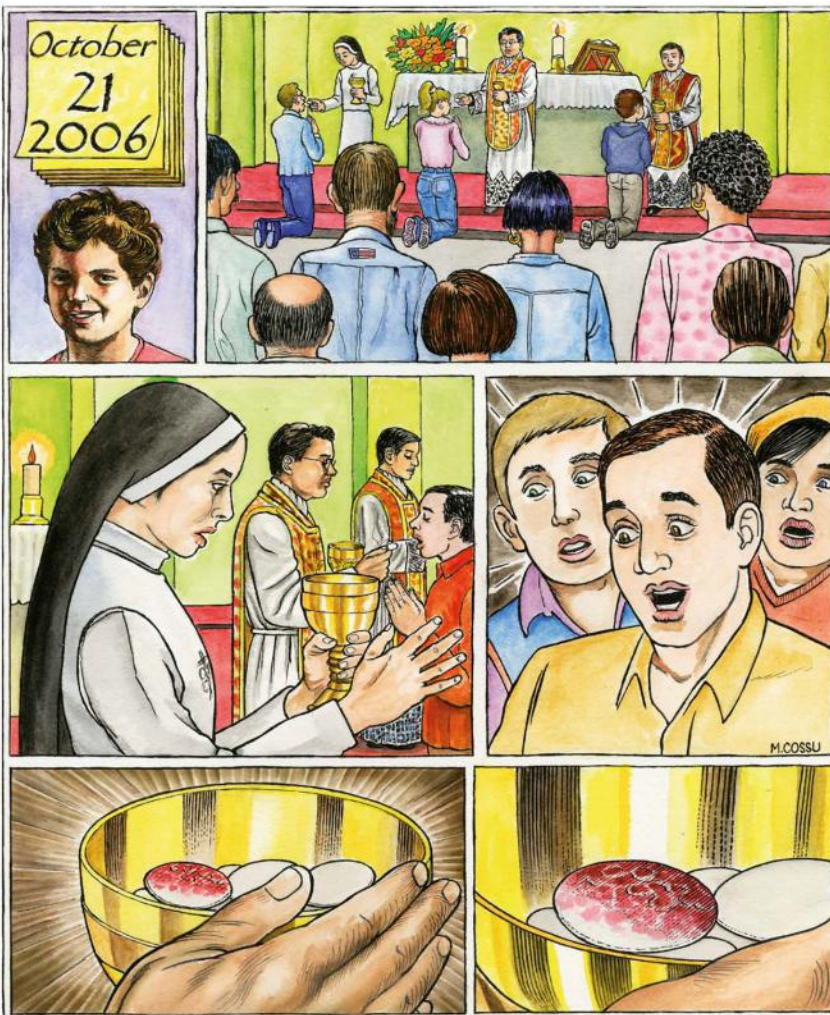
MEXICO, OCTOBER 21, 2006



On October 12, 2013, H.E. Most Rev. Alejo Zavala Castro, Bishop of the Diocese of Chilpancingo-Chilapa, announced through a Pastoral Letter the recognition of the Eucharistic Miracle that occurred at Tixtla, on October 21, 2006. In the letter we read: "This manifestation brings to us a marvelous sign of the love of God that confirms the Real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist... In my role as Bishop of the Diocese I recognize the supernatural character of the series of events relating to the Bleeding Host of Tixtla... I declare the case as a "Divine Sign ...".



The Host which bled



On October 21, 2006, the appearance of a reddish substance was noted as flowing from a consecrated Host during Mass at Tixtla, in the Diocese of Chilpancingo-Chilapa. Father Leopoldo Roque, pastor of the Parish of Saint Martin of Tours, invited Fr. Raymundo Reyna Esteban to lead a spiritual retreat for his parishioners. As Fr. Leopoldo and another priest were distributing Communion, assisted by a religious Sister, this Sister turned towards Fr. Leopold with the ciborium containing the Sacred Particles, looking at Father with eyes filled with tears. Immediately attracting his attention, the priest saw that the Host that Sister had taken to give Communion to a parishioner had seemingly begun to bleed.

The local bishop, Bp. Alejo Zavala Castro, convened a Theological Commission of Investigation to study the host. In October 2009, he invited Doctor Ricardo Castañón Gómez to lead a scientific investigation into the possibly miraculous event. Doctor Castañón Gómez had previously led scientific studies on two other possible Eucharistic Miracles at Saint Mary's Catholic Church in Buenos Aires.

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JULY 10, 2022

This weekend (July 9th/10th), the Church celebrates the **Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. As previously mentioned, there are thirty-four weeks of Ordinary Time. This means that, throughout the past liturgical year, we have already seen unfolded before our eyes the entire series of the Mysteries of our Redemption (from **Advent** to the **Ascension**). And, yet, we still have nearly half the liturgical year ahead of us.

Having celebrated the sublime drama that absorbed our very existence, we now enter into this time to reflect on what we have experienced. The celebration of these mysteries cannot be an empty pageant, acted only for the sake of being looked at. Instead, the mystery of Salvation must influence every aspect of our lives. What we have experienced in the liturgical year and now hear proclaimed in the Gospels is meant to further the Christian life in our lives. To truly put into practice that which we have received.

Throughout these many weeks, we are given the example of the Saints as witnesses who have kept the Faith (2 Timothy 4:7-8). We share in the sufferings that the Saints lived out and exult in the triumphs that they have won out. The numerous feast days over these many months (and throughout the whole year), often celebrated during our weekday Masses, are meant to serve as a reminder: The Saints are in union with Jesus Christ in Heaven. And, this unity, now lived out by the Saints in Heaven, is a unity which we are called to join.

In our "Kid's Bulletin", our youth are offered a look into the life of different Saints. This weekend focuses on St. Bonaventure, the 14th Century Franciscan and a Doctor of the Church, whose feast day falls this Friday (July 15th). This weekly offering is meant to remind our youth that they have friends in Heaven. And, no matter how wise we might become in years, we too should never forget this simple lesson: We have friends in Heaven. And, we should learn about them!

Another great Saint celebrated this week is St. Kateri Tekakwitha. On Thursday, July 14th, we celebrate the Memorial of St. Kateri, a 17th Century Algonquin-Mohawk convert to the Catholic Faith. Her mother was a Christian Algonquin, taken captive by the Iroquois and given as wife to the chief of the Mohawk clan. When Kateri was four, she lost her parents and little brother in a smallpox epidemic that left her disfigured and half blind. She was adopted by her uncle, who succeeded her father as chief.

Kateri was moved by the words of three Jesuit missionaries who lodged with her uncle, but fear kept her from seeking instruction. As she grew, she refused to marry a Mohawk brave, and, at age 19, courageously took the step of converting. She was baptized with the name Kateri (Catherine) on Easter Sunday in 1676. For accepting baptism, she was treated as an outcast among her own community. For her own safety, she walked 200-miles to a Christian Indian village at Sault St. Louis, near Montreal.

Over the next three years, Kateri gave herself totally to God in long hours of prayer, in charity, and in acts of penance. At the age of 23, Kateri took a vow of virginity, an unprecedented act for an Indian woman whose future depended on being married. After undergoing a long illness, Kateri passed into her reward on April 17, 1680. Those who were with her testified that, at her death, her smallpox scars disappeared, and her skin became radiant. She quickly became known as the "Lily of the Mohawks" as knowledge of her life spread.
