

Eucharistic Miracle of

In St. Hyacinth's church in Legnica, during Holy Mass, on December 25, 2013, a Host accidentally fell on the ground, during distribution of Communion. It was immediately placed in a container with water and closed in the tabernacle as required by code of Canon Law. A few days later, a red spot appeared on Its surface. The Bishop of Legnica at the time, Stefan Cichy, decided to establish a commission for a scientific analysis. The results were surprising, and confirmed that It similarities to "human heart muscle with alterations that often appear during the agony".







On April 10, 2016, Bishop Zbigniew Kiernikowski officially announced the results of the analysis of the Eucharist miracle which took place



and cardiologist Professor Bari Engel, who was one of the scientists involved in the scientific analysis, said during the press conference: "The material was analyzed using UV rays with an orange filter and the results were univocal. We have identified myocardial fibres, typical of myocardial tissue with alterations that often appear during the agony

During Christmas Day Mass in 2013 at St. Hyacinth's Church in Legnica, Belgium, a Host was accidently dropped during the distribution of Holy Communion. Being immediately retrieved, the Host was placed in a cruet of water to be dissolved and locked in the tabernacle. After two weeks, it was discovered that the Host had not dissolved in the water; Instead, Fr. Andrzej Ziombra, the pastor of St. Hyacinth noted that, instead of dissolving, "a red spot covering a fifth of its surface appeared" on the Host.

At the request of the local bishop, a special scientific commission was formed to analyze the Host. With samples taken from the Host on January 26, 2014, the Wrocław Medical University found that the particles of the Host examined were myocardial, or heart, tissue. A blind, secondary study by the Institute of Forensic Medicine in Szczecin, Poland, found that the particles were "tissue fragments containing fragmented parts of cross-striated muscle," which is tissue from the "human heart muscle with stresses that often appear in tissue suffering from great toture." The "red spot" on the Host was determined to be human blood. Given these results, the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith recognised the supernatural nature of the event.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JULY 24, 2022

Next weekend will be Fr. John's last weekend with us. We thank him for his attentive care of our parish over the past many weekends and ask God's blessings upon his future ministry.

This weekend (July 23rd/24th), the Church celebrates the **Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In our readings this weekend, we continue with our focus on prayer. In the Gospel reading (Luke 11:1-13), having been taught the **Our Father**, we are reminded of the importance of persistence in prayer and the effectiveness of prayer itself. The Lord calls us into a conversation and a relationship with Him. We must now ask ourselves how often we respond to that call and turn to the Lord in prayer each day.

As it was named last year by Pope Francis, this weekend is also known as the "World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly." Falling nearest to the Feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the parents of Mary and grandparents of Jesus, we are reminded of the great gift that are our grandparents and the elderly members of our families. Their witness to us and presence with us serve as a gift for families, for society, and for the whole Church.

Writing to grandparents and the elderly on this day, Pope Francis reminds us of the power of prayer. Through their daily prayer, grandparents can become "artisans of the *revolution of tenderness* in our world!" So often, we do not truly recognize the power found in and through prayer. In the words of the Holy Father: "Our trustful prayer can do a great deal: it can accompany the cry of pain of those who suffer, and it can help change hearts."

It was my prayer that those participating in or attending the **Wells County 4-H Fair** this past week had a wonderful time. A special "Congratulations!" to all of our parishioners who took home awards over this past week from the Fair. Following Fair weekend, as is our parish custom, you can expect the **St. Joseph Giving Table** to be going up in the Narthex soon. Our yearly **St. Joseph Giving Table** serves as a place to share any extra produce from your gardens each weekend so that nothing goes to waste.

Speaking of gardens, our six garden boxes behind the Church are getting good use. Four of the garden boxes were spoken for by parishioners and, when I saw them in June, their gardens appear to be coming in quite well. The remaining two boxes have been serving as flower beds to provide fresh cut flowers for use in the Church. A special "*Thank You!*" to parishioner Louise Mayer for her hard work and green thumb caring for these two flower beds.

This Tuesday (July 26th) the Indiana General Assembly will continue with a special session that was initially convened on July 6th. While the assembly will be dealing with inflation and what to do with the state's budget surplus (serious issues in themselves), they will also be addressing the question of what our state will do regarding the regulation of abortion and the protection of unborn human lives.

As mentioned just a few weeks ago, the Supreme Court's decision on *Dobbs* overturned both *Roe v. Wade* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey*. This decision has returned the authority to regulate abortion back to each individual state. Part of the assembly's schedule this week, then, will be to look at two bills: one addressing abortion regulations in Indiana and the other on providing support to expecting mothers.

Following in the exhortation of St. Paul to St. Timothy in 1 Timothy 2:1-2, may we pray and fast fervently this week for our civil leaders approaching this special assembly. The battle to protect and safeguard human life at all stages, from conception to natural death and at every moment in between, is far from over. In everything that we do, we are called to be witnesses to the culture of life. May our prayer and daily charitable work always reflect this.


