"Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw His star at its rising and have come to do Him homage."

After Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, the Holy Family was visited by three Magi from the East. They came to worship Jesus and bring Him gifts of gold (for a king), francincense (for a priest), and myrrh (burial ointment, for one who would die).

The **FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY** is celebrated on the 12th Day of Christmas, January 6th, but in the United States is moved to the Sunday between January 2nd-8th.

On the **FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY**, it is traditional for families to bless their homes, remebering the hospitality of the Holy Family to the Wise Men and asking for protection and blessing on their home and all who enter there.

The home blessing is done by writing with chalk on the door frame the following symbols: 20+C+M+B+23. The 20 and 23 represent the current year. The + reminds us of the cross on which our Savior died. The C, M, and B stand for the names of the Wise Men (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar), as well as an abbreviation for the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat," which means "Christ bless this house." Writing on the door frame also brings to mind the Passover of the Jews and the final plague in the Book of Exodus, when the blood of the lamb protected the inhabitants within.

"In the Magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religious, the Gospel sees the first fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The Magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Insrael, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations."

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - JANUARY 8, 2023

This weekend (January $7^{\text{th}}/8^{\text{th}}$), the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Epiphany** (*which is celebrated on January* 6^{th} , *but, in the United States, is transferred to the nearest Sunday*). Historically, the **Nativity of the Lord** was originally celebrated by many Churches on this day (January 6th). This was changed, however, in AD 376 when the Holy See obliged all Churches to observe **Christmas** on December 25th, as was the practice in Rome.

As Christmas Day became universally set on our liturgical calendar, this day gained the name of the **Epiphany**. As "epiphany" means "manifestation," this celebration recognizes Jesus' three-fold manifestations to the world in the Magi, His Baptism in the Jordan, and the Wedding Feast of Cana. In the Magi, Gentiles approach Jesus bearing gifts. In His Baptism, the Holy Spirit descends upon Him and proclaims that He is the beloved Son of God. And, at the miracle of the Wedding Feast of Cana, our Lord begins His public ministry.

Normally, the **Solemnity of the Epiphany** is followed by the celebration of the **Baptism of the Lord** on the coming Sunday. However, as both **Christmas** and the **Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God** fell on Sundays, the **Baptism of the Lord** is celebrated this coming Monday on this year's liturgical calendar. This means that our Christmas season will, sadly, formally conclude tomorrow and we will enter anew into **Ordinary Time** this coming week.

With the coming end of the Christmas season, the majority of our Christmas decorations in the Church will come down and be stored away until next year. We will, however, leave the Nativity Scene within the Church up as a place for prayer until the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord** (February 2nd). This idea comes from our Holy Father, Pope Francis, who, in a speech made in the Italian town of Greccio, described the Nativity Scene as a "living Gospel."

Pope Francis explained: "When, at Christmas, we place the statue of the Infant Jesus in the manger, the nativity scene suddenly comes alive. God appears as a child, for us to take into our arms... The crib is more relevant than ever, while every day many weapons and so many violent images are made in the world, which enter the eyes and the heart. The crib is instead a handcrafted image of peace. This is why it is a living Gospel."

Taking the lead from our Holy Father, I invite and encourage you to spend time in quiet prayer before our Nativity Scene throughout the remainder of this month. Christmas is not just a memory; It is a reality. Just as Jesus Christ has entered into human history, so now He wishes to enter into our history, into our hearts. May we be prepared to celebrate every day as **Christmas Day** by helping to bring Jesus into the world through our very lives.

EPIPHANY CHALK AND HOME BLESSING

The cover of this weekend's bulletin offers a description of the Epiphany Home Blessing. Epiphany Chalk will be blessed at all Masses this weekend and will be available in the narthex as you leave. This powerful sacramental is a centuries-old practice that is meant to serve as a sign of our dedication to the Lord. In this blessing, we are to be reminded every time we see the inscription over the door that our homes and all those who dwell here belong to Christ.


