SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - MAY 14, 2023

Welcome home to all of our college students returning to the area for summer!

This weekend (May 13th/14th), the Church celebrates the **Sixth Sunday of Easter**. Throughout this **Eastertide**, our Lord continues to comfort and encourage His disciples, confirm them in the faith of His resurrection, and instruct them in the mysteries of His kingdom. These acts prepare the disciples to not only accept and understand the glories of the Risen Christ, but to be prepared to go out and preach His name to the world, as they soon will.

This coming Thursday will mark the fortieth day since **Easter Sunday**, when the **Ascension of the Lord** occurred on Mount Olivet (Luke 24:46-53). As our Lord ascends to the heavens, He promises His disciples that He will send His spirit upon them and they will then be ready to go out and preach. Traditionally known as **Ascension Thursday**, this day is celebrated as one of the holiest days of the year. In most dioceses throughout the United States, this celebration is transferred to the following Sunday to allow for greater participation at Mass.

Our nation also marks this weekend with the celebration of **Mother's Day!** We wish a **Happy Mother's Day** to all who are mothers, grandmothers, or godmothers, or who provide motherly care to others in so many ways. Mothers help to provide us with wonderful insights into what humble service and daily self-sacrifice looks like. Thank you for living out your vocation of motherhood. Know of our love, prayers, and gratitude for you.

Throughout the month of May, we also honor Mary, the Mother of God. On this weekend, may we entrust all mothers in a special way to the prayers of Our Lady, the perfect example of motherhood. Mary is not only the Mother of God, but, given to us by her Son upon the Cross (John 19:26-27), becomes a mother to us all and now intercedes for us before the throne of her Son, Jesus Christ.

SUNG MASS PARTS—KYRIE, ELEISON

During the majority of the liturgical year, save for Advent and Lent, it has been our parish custom to recite the *Kyrie*, *Eleison* (*Lord*, *have mercy*...) after the Penitential Rite and before the *Gloria*. Starting this month, we will begin to sing this short, yet beautiful, hymn at all weekend Masses throughout the year. The choir or cantor will first sing each acclamation (e.g. *Lord*, *have mercy*) which the congregation will then echo in return (*Lord*, *have mercy*).

This practice is encouraged by the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM), which helps to guide our approach to liturgy. The GIRM describes the *Kyrie, Eleison* as "a chant by which the faithful acclaim the Lord and implore his mercy" and, as a chant, "it is usually executed by everyone, that is to say, with the people and the choir or cantor taking part in it" (GIRM, Paragraph #52).

Interestingly, the *Kyrie, Eleison* remains as the last remnants of Greek in the Roman Liturgy. Traced back to at least the 4th Century, this use serves to remind us that the Mass at Rome was originally offered in Greek, which is the language of the New Testament, before eventually adopting the use of Latin. ~Fr. 
