

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JULY 21, 2024

Congratulations to all those who participated in the Wells County 4H Fair!

This weekend (July 20th/21st), the Church celebrates the **Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. The Apostles, sent away to preach the good news, now return to the Lord and, together, seek a deserted place to rest and pray. As often is the case, however, no such place was found. Instead, embarking from the boat, the Lord and the Apostles encounter a great crowd seeking them out.

Our Gospel account proceeds to lead us into the introduction of the *Feeding* of the Five Thousand from the Gospel of St. Mark. This introduction focuses on the issue of leadership for God's people rather than the Holy Eucharist itself, which will become our focus over the next five weekends. Today, though, we hear how, though He was withdrawing, Jesus' heart is moved with pity as He sees those who followed Him.

This great number who follow Him to a deserted place (*these people of a new exodus, if you will*) are hungering. Jesus is moved with pity; He satisfies their spiritual hunger by teaching them many things, thus gradually showing Himself the faithful shepherd of a new Israel. As we are about to see, Jesus will then invite His Apostles to aid Him in this role as the faithful shepherd to feed the physical and spiritual need of His people. This role has continued to the modern day through the Apostles in their successors, the Bishops.

Next weekend, we begin a month-long detour from the Gospel of St. Mark as our focus shifts to the sixth chapter of the Gospel of St. John. If we were to continue our sequential walk through the Gospel of St. Mark, we would find ourselves at the Feeding of the Five Thousand (Mark 6:34-44) next weekend. This is actually the only miracle that is recounted at least once in each of the four Gospels (save for the miracle of the Resurrection).

Instead of hearing St. Mark's account of this miracle, we will instead hear it from the *Gospel of St. John*. As we often only hear from the *Gospel of St. John* during the **Easter Season**, this deviation in the lectionary-cycle is one of great importance. After we hear this miracle account, we do not immediately return to the *Gospel of St. Mark*, but instead continue our way through the remainder of the sixth chapter from the *Gospel of St. John*.

The sixth chapter of the Gospel of St. John contains both the *Feeding of the Five Thousand* and the *Bread of Life Discourse*. In each of the three Synoptic Gospels (*St. Matthew, St. Mark, and St. Luke*), there is a clear account of what is called the Institution Narratives. These narratives provide descriptions of Jesus' actions and words at the Last Supper ("*This is my body... This is my blood...*"). Such an account, however, is absent in the *Gospel of St. John*.


Despite this account of the Last Supper being perhaps the most detailed (John 13-17), the *Gospel of St. John* does not directly include an institution narrative. Instead, the four chapters of the Last Supper highlight discipleship, service, unity, and eternal life. This is, of course, quite appropriate when we consider how the Holy Eucharist at Mass (*the true perpetuation of that which was signified at the Last Supper*) strengthens each of these qualities in us.

Transitioning from the *Feeding of the Five Thousand* to the *Bread of Life Discourse*, we begin to see why there is no institution narrative in the *Gospel of St. John*. Going from feeding physical hunger, our Lord begins to preach on that bread from heaven that satisfies our true spiritual hunger: **The Holy Eucharist**. Though many, save for the Twelve, reject and abandon Him, the Lord continues His clear teaching on His Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist.

Quite beautifully, this portion of the *Gospel of St. John* is heard from the **Seventeenth** through **Twenty-first Sundays in Ordinary Time**. This means that the very middle of our three year lectionary cycle is focused upon the Holy Eucharist. We hear this teaching proclaimed so clearly from the word of God so that our hearts might be better prepared to receive the very Word of God Himself, Jesus Christ, given to us in the Holy Eucharist. ~In Christ, Fr. DIOCESAN ANNUAL JUBILEE ANNIVERSARY MASS




