

## **DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY - APRIL 11, 2021**

To close the **Easter Octave**, we celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday** this weekend (April 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup>). First given this name in 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II, this title arises from devotion to the Divine Mercy as revealed to St. Faustina Kowalska. On this day, we are reminded of how God's mercy can overcome the death of the soul to sin just as Christ overcame death itself. In this way, we conclude the **Easter Octave** prepared to face the world and preach the name of Divine Mercy, Jesus Christ.

**Easter** is not just an event to be remembered, but is a reality that we continue living in our lives. The **Easter season** runs for 50 days, just as Christ remained on the earth for 50 days, appearing to His disciples and giving them the commission to evangelize, until His ascension into Heaven. The 50-day joy of Easter should be lived just as intensely as the 40-day preparation of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent.

#### UPDATES TO OUR LITURGICAL DIRECTIVES

This past Tuesday, Gov. Holcomb's newest executive order has made significant changes to our state's COVID19-related precautions. The same day, Bishop Rhoades released the latest updates for our diocesan liturgical directives (quoted as follows). Regarding masking, "our Catholic infectious disease consultants recommend retaining that diocesan requirement (which predated the state's mask mandate) for the time being. As with all our precautionary measures, the mask rule will continue to be reevaluated, taking into account positive developments on various fronts of the pandemic."

In regards to **social distancing**, we can "begin utilizing every pew in parts of the church if this is necessary to accommodate Mass crowds as long as the pews maintain three feet of distance in front of and behind parishioners." Thankfully, our pews are able to meet this three feet accommodation and will allow us to begin safely increasing our church's capacity. This has become needed as more people feel safe returning to public worship, especially at our 10 AM Sunday Mass which has begun to make use of our overflow seating in the Parish Social Hall.

Starting next Sunday (April 18<sup>th</sup>), we will remove the ropes between the <u>last five pews in the back of the Church</u>. The remainder of the Church, however, will remain spaced at six feet intervals (every other pew). This means that, if you would feel more comfortable having an empty pew in front and behind you, please sit in the pews closer to the front of the Church. (We will continue to monitor attendance at each liturgy and make adjustments as needed.)

Finally, we will continue, for the time being, our current practice of sanitizing pews after each Mass with disinfecting wipes. Given our understanding of the rarity of surface transmission of COVID19, we are looking into different disinfecting methods that can be used on our pews that will be less damaging to their finish. This will most likely include the use of a spray disinfectant that can be applied to the pews in-between Mass times. Updates to come as we look more into these available options.

As always, the updated diocesan liturgical directives are available in-full on our parish website. I thank you, once again, for your patience and understanding as we try to best follow and respect these directives given to us by Bishop Rhoades.


#### RAISED FLOWER/GARDEN BEDS




