

Celebrating **Ordinary Time**

In Ordinary Time the Church unfolds the whole of Christ's mystery. our hope and life in Him, especially at Holy Mass on Sundays as the Word enables us to grow and bear good fruit in "time throughout the year" (tempus per annum)

The season begins on the Monday following the Sunday after lanuary 6 and continues until the day before Ash Wednesday; it begins again on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday and ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday of Advent




THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JUNE 13, 2021

Though we have been out of the **Easter Season** for the past three weeks, we are only now seeing a return of the **green** of **Ordinary Time**. Following our last two weekends that celebrated the **Solemnities of the Holy Trinity** and of *Corpus Christi*, the Church now enters into the **Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time** this weekend (*June 12th/13th*).

Throughout **Ordinary Time**, we will continue to walk with our Lord through the Gospel of St. Mark. During this time, we are called to grow in the moral life. Or, as St. Paul describes, to "attain to the unity of faith and knowledge of the Son of God." (Ephesians 4:13)

This weekend, we celebrate and pray for our high school graduates. At today's 10 AM morning Mass, our graduates join us in their caps and gowns as we congratulate them on their graduation and ask the Lord to bless them as they enter into the next stages of their lives. We will conclude this Mass with a special blessing prayed over our graduates. May we keep each of them, and all of our students, in our prayers.

At this time of year, I always call to mind the words my childhood pastor shared with us at our graduation: "Stay close to the Catholic Church and you will be at peace." As I would later learn, his words were not his own, but were paraphrasing the words of St. Padre Pio: "Stay close to the Catholic Church at all times, for the Church alone can give you true peace, since She alone possesses Jesus, the true Prince of Peace in the Blessed Sacrament." May each graduate always know this true peace of Jesus in their lives.


FREE MONTHLY BOOKS IN THE NARTHEX




