

THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH - DECEMBER 31, 2023

This weekend, the Church continues her celebrations within the **Christmas Octave** with the **Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph**. This feast finds its roots with the founding of the *Confraternity of the Holy Family* in Montreal in 1663. By 1684, this devotion to the Holy Family led to the creation of a liturgical feast day for the Holy Family that was celebrated throughout the Archdiocese of Montreal. Initially celebrated the Sunday after the Epiphany, this feast was moved into the Easter season to allow for great celebration outside of Montreal's harsh winters.

In the 19th Century, this devotion to the Holy Father was heavily promoted by Pope Leo XIII. The Holy Father saw this devotion as an antidote to the troubles plaguing the family in a newly industrialized world. In an 1891 papal encyclical, Leo XIII referred to the family as "the cradle of civil society" and, by 1893, instituted the Feast of the Holy Family as a liturgical celebration to be celebrated in any diocese that requested it.

Sharing the same concerns as his predecessor, Pope Benedict XV placed this feast day on the liturgical calendar of the universal Church in 1921. It was his hope that, following the First World War, devotion to the Holy Family would lead to a renewal of both familial and societal life. This feast seeks to portray the Holy Family of Nazareth as the true model of life from which our own families can draw inspiration and find help and comfort.

This New Year's Eve (December 31st), we will once count down the seconds to say farewell to this past year and welcome a new year in the Lord. Continuing with our New Year's tradition these past few years, you are invited to "choose" a Saint to get to know throughout the new year. As we know, however, in the wise and loving plan of Jesus Christ, it is not we who choose the Saint but the Saints who chooses us!

You can find a basket in the narthex with little strips of paper, each with a Saint's name and a little biographical information, for you to take with you. This practice, first started by Saint Faustina Kowalska (of the Divine Mercy apparition), invites us to spend the year learning about our Saint, both historically and spiritually. In inviting these Saints into our lives, they become intercessors on our behalf before the Lord (James 5:17) amid the coming graces and challenges of the New Year.

As is the custom, our New Year's celebrations are often marked by making resolutions for the New Year. This year, one of my resolutions is to spend a greater amount of time studying the early Church Fathers. These titans of our Faith, though often overlooked, are a true source of a treasury of spiritual insights into the life of the Lord and the early days of the Church. I hope to be able to share some of what I learn with you in the coming New Year.


MARY, MOTHER OF GOD

On Monday, January 1st, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God**. This ancient celebration is traced back to at least the 5th Century and the Council of Ephesus. This ecumenical council recognized Mary as *Theotokos, or "God-bearer.*" As this celebration falls on Monday this year, though a holy day, it is **not** a holy day of obligation this year. Though not a holy day of obligation, it can be seen as a *holy day of opportunity*. To celebrate this solemnity and mark the end of the Christmas Octave, join us for a special Mass for this solemnity on **Monday, January 1st, at 7 PM**.
