

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 4, 2024

This weekend (February 3rd/4th), the Church celebrates the **Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. This means that we are now only a week and a half away from **Ash Wednesday** and the start of the *Lenten season*. During **Lent**, we pray the *Stations of the Cross* every Friday at 7 PM. All are welcome!

This past Friday, we celebrated the **Presentation of the Lord** to mark forty days since **Christmas Day**. This was the day that our Lord, fulfilling the Law of Moses (*Leviticus 12:1-8*), this was presented in the Temple by the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph. We heard how Simeon prophesied that Jesus is a *"light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel"* (*Luke 2:32*). It was a final moment of Christmas joy in our liturgical year.

With this celebration, the last of our Christmas decorations (*e.g. the Nativity scene*) have been put away. We truly have returned to **Ordinary Time** and a season of simplicity. Quite appropriately, our gloomy weather has seemingly matched our current place in the liturgical year. Just as the sun has been hidden by the overcast sky, so the last fleeting joys of our *Christmas season* have gone away and we will soon be overcast by the scandal of the Cross.

Though it seems overcast now, we know that the divine Sun of Justice that rose brightly in Bethlehem has not left us. Just as the sun is still there behind the clouds, the Word became flesh so that He might dwell among us and He remains with us even now. As we approach the *Lenten season*, we know that even darker clouds await as the Lord approaches His Passion. Yet, even those terrible clouds will soon be dispersed by the light of His Resurrection.

ASH WEDNESDAY AND ROOFING NAILS

A priest that I served with would give out roofing nails on **Ash Wednesday** and invite them to be carried in one's pocket for the forty days of **Lent**. As roofing nails are blunt, there was no danger in carrying one in your pocket. Instead, it was just awkward enough of a shape to be annoying. At the end of the forty days, you would be quite happy to get rid of it.


The lesson was simple: *The nail represented sin and we want to get rid of sin from our lives*. Sin can be both mortal (*deadly*) and venial (*harmful*). Both are to be avoided, yet often our focus is only on mortal sin, or those sins that break our relationship with God. Yet, in the Christian life, we are called to root out **all** sin from our lives, both those that destroy our relationship and those that harm it. **Lent** is a time to focus on the rooting out of all sin from our lives.

During Lent, we enter into the desert with the Lord. As the Lord found strength and virtue in facing temptation in the desert, so the disciplines of Lent aid us in strengthening our will to say no to sin. For this reason, we often adapt the practice of making some form of sacrifice during Lent. In "giving up" something during Lent, we turn away from ourselves and recognize that God alone will ultimately satisfy our needs and wants and cravings.

At the very end of our lives, we will leave our gifts of time, treasure, and our bodies in the grave until the Resurrection. The *Lenten season* affords us the opportunity and challenge to live now as children of our heavenly Father, reliant on His grace and providence, and eager to find our hopes fulfilled in God alone. As we quickly approach **Lent**, let us prayerfully discern what sacrifice we are called to make for these forty days and what that sacrifice is meant to reveal or free us from in our lives.

RETURNING PALMS FOR ASH WEDNESDAY

As a reminder, next Sunday (Feb. 11th) is the last day to turn in old palms before **Ash Wednesday**. These palms that were lifted high on **Palm Sunday** will be burned and the ashes they make will be used to mark our foreheads on **Ash Wednesday**. Just as the lifting of the palms represented Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, so the ashes mark our entry into the desert with the Lord for the *Lenten season*. Both of these journeys lead to the Cross. The good news, however, is that neither of these journeys end there. ~In Christ, Fr. David


