This weekend (February 17th/18th), the Church celebrates the First Sunday in Lent. In the words of St. Augustine of Hippo: As we soon celebrate the Passion of our crucified Lord, it is therefore in keeping with our commitment to Him that we should crucify ourselves by restraining the desires of the flesh. These forty days of Lent are guided by the spiritual weapons of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We will continue our parish practice of almsgiving with our annual **Lenten Food Drive**. St. Joseph Statue in the Narthex

As we are just a month away from our patronal feast day, the Solemnity of St. Joseph, we are blessed to "unveil" a new statue of St. Joseph in our narthex this weekend. This statue was originally stored by our Knights of Columbus from a closed hermitage in Decatur. We've since helped relocate many of the sacred items from the hermitage for use in various churches.

Of the items, two have remained for use in our own parish: The portable altar we use for our altar of repose on Holy Thursday and this St. Joseph statue. The statue itself was in need of a bit of repair and repainting. This work was recently completed for us by the Fort Wayne-based William L. Lupkin Designs. Our own parishioner and master craftsman, Joe Bauer, skillfully crafted the base on which St. Joseph now stands.

We will bless this statue of our patron as a part of our annual St. Joseph **Table**, celebrated the weekend near the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19th). As St. Joseph was charged with the care of the Holy Family, so we place our parish family under his prayerful protection. St. Joseph, foster-father of the Lord and protector of the universal Church, pray for us!

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON & COMMUNION ANTIPHON

Beginning this weekend, our cantors will sing the entrance and communion antiphons at our weekend Masses. The entrance antiphon will be sung prior to the opening hymn and the communion antiphon after the priest has received Holy Communion. These short, beautiful, and meditative scriptural verses offer us tremendous insight into the themes of our weekly liturgy.

Quite often, many Sundays received nicknames based upon the antiphons that were sung. For example, Laetare Sunday is called such as the entrance antiphon begins with the word "Laetare," or "Rejoice!" May we listen both attentively and prayerfully to our cantors and allow these verses taken from the Sacred Scriptures to help prepare your hearts so that they might be "burning within us" (Luke 24:32) as we enter and participate in the sacred mysteries.

RITE OF ELECTION

After our last Mass this Sunday, I will be traveling with our *Catechumens* and Candidates for Full Communion to the Cathedral of the Immaculate **Conception** in Fort Wayne. There, these eight men and women who have been preparing over this past year, will join all those preparing to enter the Church and be welcomed and greeted by Bishop Rhoades. Let us continue to pray for these men and women as they prepare to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil.


ONWARDS TO PILGRIMAGE!
