#### FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - NOVEMBER 28, 2021

Happy Liturgical New Year! This weekend (Nov. 27<sup>th</sup>/28<sup>th</sup>), the Church begins a new year of grace as we enter into the First Sunday of Advent. Throughout this cycle of the liturgical year, we will walk with our Lord Jesus Christ through the Gospel of St. Luke. St. Luke is believed to be both a physician and a companion of St. Paul and, as seen in Luke 1:1-4 and Acts 1:1-3, is the author of both this gospel and the Acts of the Apostles.

Though beginning a new liturgical and entering a new season, we may notice that our readings seem to continue the same apocalyptic trend that we have heard throughout the past several weekends. This serves as a reminder that the **Advent Season** is meant to prepare us for the **two** comings of Jesus Christ: His Second Coming at the end of time and the historical Incarnation.

The first three Sundays of Advent will focus on the Lord's Second Coming, while the last Sunday (from Dec. 17th onward) will focus on our preparation to celebrate His birth on Christmas Day. The entire Advent **Season** is meant to challenge us and calls us to conversion. We are being tasked with preparing our hearts to truly be prepared to welcome Jesus Christ into the world and into our lives.

To assist in this call to conversion, we, as a parish, have several resources and opportunities available. Our *Little Blue Books* (available in English and Spanish) and a variety of Advent Calendars are available in the narthex. For charitable outreach, we are participating in both the **Blessing Tree** (which is already underway) and an **Advent Food Drive** to support the *Wells County* Food Bank. For prayer, join us this week for our Praise and Worship Holy Hour on Wednesday, Dec. 1st, from 6 - 7 PM and First Friday Adoration on Friday, Dec. 3rd, from 9 AM - 6 PM. What better way to enter into this **Advent Season** than by spending time with our Lord in Adoration!

#### DECEMBER PLANNING - HOLY DAYS AND CHRISTMAS

Though Advent is only beginning, it doesn't hurt to look ahead and plan for upcoming Holy Days and Mass obligations. The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation, on Wednesday, Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>. We will offer **four** different Mass times on this day: A vigil Mass on Tuesday, Dec. 7th, at 5:30 PM and Masses on Wednesday, **Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 AM, Noon, and 7:00 PM\*** (with Choir).

As Christmas Day falls on a Saturday this year, we find ourselves in a unique situation. Christmas is always a Holy Day of Obligation and, being one of the holiest days in our entire liturgical year, this obligation is never transferred to another day. This means that we are called to attend and assist at two separate Masses between December 24th-26th, one for our yearly Christmas obligation and the other for our weekly Sunday obligation. Please see the included handout with Mass times to help guide you in discerning how to best fulfill these two obligations for the Lord.

For **Christmas**, there will be several different Mass times offered to allow us to welcome guests and help prevent overcrowding at any individual Mass. On Friday, Dec. 24th, the Vigil Masses will be at 4 PM, 6 PM, and Midnight, and, on Saturday, Dec. 25th, Mass will be at 9 AM. At 4 PM, we will bless our Nativity Scene; At 6 PM, our Adult and Children Choir will lead us in song (Join the Choir for Christmas Carols at 5:30 PM, prior to the 6 PM Mass); At Midnight, Mass will be offered by Christmas lights and candlelight.




## Planning for Christmas and the Feast of the Holy Family




