FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - DECEMBER 3, 2023

This **Friday, December 8**th, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception**, a <u>holy day of obligation</u>. The Blessed Virgin, under this title, is the patroness of both our diocese and our country, giving us even greater reason to celebrate this solemnity. The best way to crown our celebration is by joining together in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. To help fulfill our obligation to assist at Mass on this holy day, our Masses for the Immaculate Conception are offered as follows:

Thursday, Dec. 7th - Vigil Mass - 7:00 PM Friday, Dec. 8th - Mass - 7:00 AM, Noon, 7:00 PM

This weekend (December 2nd/3rd), the Church starts a new liturgical year of God's grace as we enter into the **First Sunday of Advent**. Having walked through the Gospel of St. Matthew this past year, we will now begin anew our walk with the Lord through the Gospel of St. Mark. This Gospel was written to a primarily Gentile audience, demonstrated by their unfamiliarity with Jewish customs (cf. Mark 7:3–4, 11), sometime shortly before the destruction of the Temple in A.D. 70.

Given the brevity of the Gospel of St. Mark, being the shortest of the three synoptic Gospels, we will also have an opportunity to hear from the Gospel of St. John (normally proclaimed throughout the Easter Season) right in the middle of this liturgical year. Quite beautifully, this jaunt into the Gospel of St. John takes us through the Bread of Life Discourse and our Lord's clear teaching on the gift of the Eucharist. How appropriate that our entire three-year lectionary cycle keeps us centered on the Eucharist.

Advent, though a brief season, is one of great importance. As the world and our culture has already embraced the secular "holiday season," we recognize in **Advent** that **Christmas** is not yet here. We are only now beginning our preparations, not simply for a holiday, but for the holy day that welcomes the birth of our Savior. May we not lose sight of this important **season of Advent** in our desire to welcome **Christmas Day**.

The prayer on our bulletin cover, taken from the *Hallow.com* App's "Complete Guide to the Season of Advent," offers a simple way to invite God's calming presence in our lives amid the many distractions of the season. We can see these good things as foretaste for the true joy that awaits, both on Christmas Day and on the last day when we are face to face with the Lord Himself. For this is the true purpose of both the **Advent season** and the entire liturgical year: **To prepare us for Christ.**

Liturgically, we welcome this preparation by embracing several seasonal "penitential" practices. First, we deprive ourselves of the *Gloria*, which is a hymn of praise. Like the Blessed Mother, we are called to hold these words in our hearts and ponder them (Luke 2:19) throughout **Advent** until **Christmas Day**. We do see a brief reprieve from this practice, however, on the upcoming holy day. As it is a solemnity, we once again sing out the *Gloria* on that day as a brief a glimpse reminding us of what we are preparing for.

Second, our normal candlesticks and bleached candles are replaced by wooden candlesticks and unbleached candles. These adornments in the sanctuary help us to recognize the simplicity and penitential nature of the season. Lastly, the vestments, chalice veil, and adornments of the sanctuary are violet. This liturgical color is meant to symbolize the penance, sacrifice, and preparation we undertake during this season.

These various elements of preparation remind us that we are preparing for something. **Advent** prepares us for **Christmas**. Our life is meant to prepare us for Christ. **Christmas** is not just a day, but an entire season. In the same way, life with Christ is not simply a moment, but an eternity. We are made for heaven. And, this liturgical year is made to help us get there. Let us use everyday of it as a chance to grow closer and closer to Christ. ~In Christ, Fr. David
