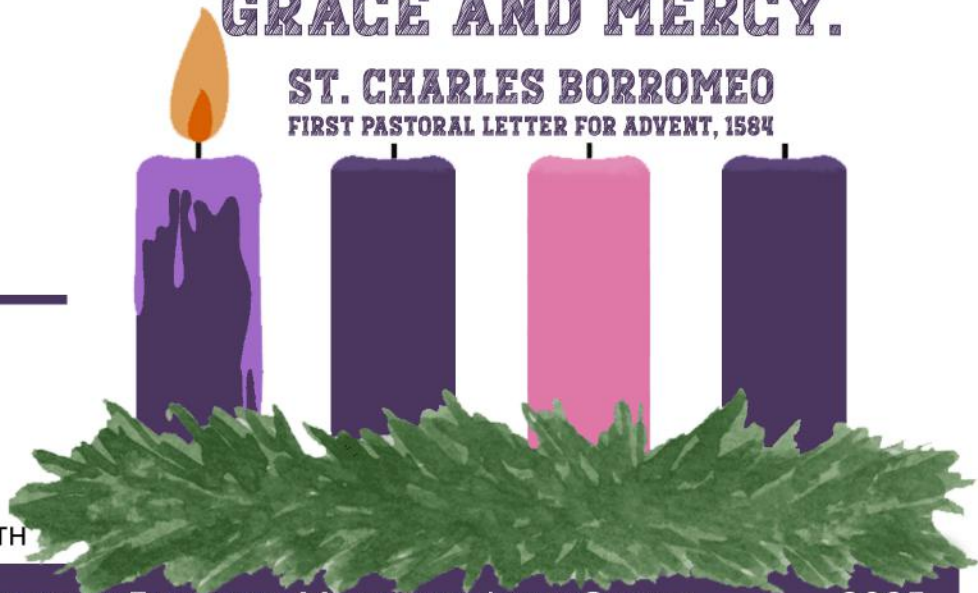

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - NOVEMBER 30, 2025

Happy Liturgical New Year! This weekend (Nov. 29th/30th), the Church celebrates the **First Sunday of Advent**. During this season, we look back with gratitude to Bethlehem and forward with hope to Christ's return in glory. This season, its roots reaching back to at least the 4th Century, serves as a time for prayer and fasting in preparation for the *coming* (*adventus*) of **Christmas Day**.

This season was often referred to as "*little Lent*" and ranged anywhere from three to six weeks, depending on the local custom. It has held to the four week structure that we know today since the 9th Century. Overall, the purpose of this preparatory and penitential season is to open our hearts to the Lord who has come into the world. Or, in the thought of St. Augustine of Hippo: *To love His first coming so that we may be ready to rejoice at His second coming.*

"Advent invites us to a daily discipline of silence, to hear the voice of God in our hearts." These words of Pope St. John Paul II highlight one of the ways we can best enter into the Advent season. Going against the busyness and noise of the world, we embrace the silence that will lead us into that holy and quiet night on which Christ was born. In silence and stillness, we open our hearts to hear the voice of the Christ-child calling out to us.

Liturgically, we embrace this call to silence by inviting more silence into our liturgy. Throughout **Advent**, the **Gloria** is not intoned or prayed (*save for solemnities*). This hymn of praise will not spring forth from our lips until we join our song with that of the angelic choir that first proclaimed "*Glory to God*" to the shepherds. Likewise, our closing hymn will give way to silence to reflect that quiet anticipation and longing of the heart for the Christ-child.

Similarly, with the new liturgical year, we have now completed praying our **Parish 150th Anniversary Prayer** before each Mass. We will now take those few moments before Mass as a time for recollection. Likewise, we will conclude our Communion Hymn at the reposition of the Most Holy Eucharist after the distribution of Holy Communion. The purification of the vessels will take place in silence to allow for a few extra moments of quiet contemplation.

Our liturgical accoutrements also take on a more "*silent*" nature as well. Our gilded candlesticks and altar crucifix are switched for their wooden replacements. The wood lacks that luster of the more precious metals. Similarly, the bleached candles are replaced with unbleached beeswax. These elements provide a visual "*silence*" that is muted in color, humble in appearance, and reminiscent of the simplicity of Bethlehem.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION

As a reminder, the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception**, a **holy day of obligation**, is quickly approaching. In 1846, the Sixth Provincial Council of Baltimore dedicated our nation, on its seventieth anniversary, under the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the title of the Immaculate Conception. Interestingly enough, this dedication was done several years prior to the infallible promulgation of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception.

To aide in our obligation to assist at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for this holy day, we will offer four Masses for the Holy Day. There will be a Vigil Mass on Sunday, December 7th at 5 PM and Masses on Monday, December 8th at 7 AM, Noon, and 7 PM.

Please Note: We have an obligation to assist at Masses for ***both*** the **Second Sunday of Advent** and the **Holy Day of the Immaculate Conception**. The special Sunday Vigil Mass can count for ***ONE*** of these obligations, ***NOT*** both.
