FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT - FEBRUARY 26, 2023

A special "Thank You!" to our G.I.R.L's Night Out for hosting our second annual Mardi Gras Fundraiser. With 100+ people in attendance, it was a wonderful evening of fraternity in support of some great causes.

This weekend (February 25th/26th), the Church celebrates the **First Sunday of Lent**. This season serves as our time of preparation for **Easter** and, as we hear in the Gospel today, is itself rooted in our Lord's own forty days of fasting in the desert. Through His personal example, our Lord re-emphasizes that the practice of fasting, so frequently ordered in the Old Law, is to be also practiced by the Children of the New Law, the Church.

This season is itself one that is rich in mysteries. The forty days of this season not only call to mind our Lord's time in the desert, but also harken back to the forty days of the flood (Genesis 7:12), the forty years that Israel sojourned in the desert before being permitted to enter the Promised Land (Numbers 14:33), and the forty days during which the Prophet Ezekiel lay on his right side as a sign of the destruction that would befall Jerusalem (Ezekiel 4:6).

In addition, we recall how both Moses (Exodus 24:18) and Elijah (1 Kings 19:8) fasted for forty days before approaching God on Mounts Sinai and Horeb, respectively. With these mysterious before us, we can begin to understand why it was that the Son of God, having become Man for our salvation, and wishing to subject himself to the pain of fasting, chose the number of forty days.

THE LIGHT IS ON FOR YOU - TUESDAY, MARCH 14TH

This Lent, each Catholic church in our diocese will have confessions available on **Tuesday, March 14th, from 6-8 PM** as a part of **The Light Is On For You** Campaign. This yearly campaign emphasizes the beauty and availability of the Sacrament of Confession throughout our diocese. If you have been away from this Sacrament for some time, I encourage you to never be afraid to return to it and encounter the Lord's loving mercy and forgiveness in our lives.

PARISH PENANCE SERVICE - WEDNESDAY, MARCH 29TH

In addition to **The Light Is On For You** Campaign, we will also have our **Lenten Penance Service** on **Wednesday, March 29th, from 6:00 - 7:00 PM**. We will have myself and at least three other priests available to hear Confessions throughout the hour. During this time, we will also have Adoration going on in the Church followed by our normal Wednesday evening Mass at 7:00 PM.

Throughout Lent, we also have our regular Confession schedule. This includes Confessions offered every **Tuesday from 8:30-9:00 AM**, **Wednesday from 6:00-6:45 PM**, and **Saturday from both 8:30-9:00 AM and 4:00-4:45 PM**. In addition, Confession is also offered every **First Friday of the month from 5:00-5:45 PM** and can always be provided at any other time by appointment.

LENTEN TRIVIA - THE HISTORY OF THE PRETZEL

The pretzel has a deep spiritual meaning for Lent. It originated as an ancient Christian Lenten bread as far back as the fourth century. Throughout the Roman Empire, the Faithful kept a very strict fast all through Lent: No milk, butter, cheese, eggs, cream or meat. (*Many Eastern Catholic Churches still follow some form of this stricter Lenten fast.*) Instead, they would make small breads of water, flour and salt, to remind themselves that Lent was a time of prayer.

The bread was shaped in the form of crossed arms, following the local custom of crossing one's arms over the breast while praying. Therefore, the breads were called "*bracellae*" (meaning "little arms") in the common Latin of the day. From this Latin word, the Germanic people would later coin the term "pretzel." Thus the pretzel is the most appropriate food symbol in Lent.

Even to this day, the pretzel still shows the form of arms crossed in prayer, reminding us that Lent is a time of prayer. It consists only of water and flour, thus proclaiming Lent as a time of fasting. In many places throughout Europe, it remains customary to serve pretzels only in Lent, thus keeping this ancient symbolism alive. The earliest picture and description of a pretzel may be found in an original fifth century codex preserved in the Vatican Library. \sim Fr. David
