FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JULY 6, 2025

Welcome to all those joining us for the Fourth of July Holiday, whether you are with us while visiting family or camping at the State Park. May you have a blessed and relaxing holiday and know that you are always welcome at St. Joseph's!

This weekend (July 5th/6th), the Church celebrates the **Fourteenth Sunday** in Ordinary Time. It is the first Sunday since the beginning of March that we are now back to wearing the green of Ordinary Time. We will remain in this season throughout the next five months until the liturgical year ends with the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe and a new year in God's grace begins with the start of Advent.

Our journey through the remaining twenty **Sundays of Ordinary Time** will unfold with a steady rhythm, broken only by two meaningful interludes. On September 14th, we will celebrate the **Solemnity of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross**, and on November 2nd, the **Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed**. Though these days may seem distinct, they draw us to a singular truth: *The hope we share in Christ's triumph over death*.

The flow of the liturgical year is meant to remind us that the Church is alive! The liturgical year, like our life, is a journey; It walks with us through every season of life. For this reason, the year shifts in color, tone, and rhythm: From **Advent's** preparation to **Christmas** joy, from **Lent's** sorrow to **Easter** triumph. Even in the quiet of **Ordinary Time** as we are learning how to live. The Church is big enough for all of it, for all of life in Christ, for our life.

As we enter back into **Ordinary Time**, we continue our journey through the **St. Luke's Gospel**. We are now picking up in the tenth chapter of the Gospel, placing us at Jesus' final journey, His fateful "*death march*" toward Jerusalem that formally began in Luke 9:51. Yet, despite the foreshadowing of His coming suffering and death that immediately preceded our Gospel reading, this Sunday finds us temporarily caught up in the joy of Jesus' ministry.

In sending out and receiving back His disciples, Jesus forms around Himself a spiritual "*Jerusalem*," a community called to embody peace and restoration. Through their healing ministry, they fulfill the ancient prophecies of the Lord's holy city. Though often overshadowed by the Twelve, the seventy-two disciples played a vital role in God's plan, anticipating the Church's wider mission of service, spiritual authority, and radical trust in divine providence.

ST. JOE COOKS - 150TH ANNIVERSARY COOKBOOK


