

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JANUARY 28, 2024

This weekend (January 25th/26th), the Church celebrates the **Fourth Sunday** in **Ordinary Time**. In today's Gospel, we hear of how Jesus preaches with authority. This authoritative preaching continues even today as our Lord continues to preach to us today in His Church, His Body here on earth. Truly, the Church is an extension of Jesus into the world. Our bulletin cover offers some insight into the means by which this authoritative preaching continues.

This coming Friday, February 2nd, will mark forty days since **Christmas Day**. On this day, the Church celebrates the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord**, when our Lord would have been presented in the Temple by our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph in accordance with the Law of Moses. Highlighting the words of Simeon, who recognizes Jesus as a "light to the nations," this feast is also often known as *Candlemas*.

We are also now just two and a half weeks away from **Ash Wednesday** and the beginning of the *Lenten season*. For your planning purposes, we will offer Masses on **Ash Wednesday** (February 14th) at 7 AM, Noon, and 7 PM. With this beautiful penitential season so near, now is a good time to start preparing for it. I would encourage you to use these coming few weeks as an opportunity to prayerfully discern how you might approach this season.

Traditionally, **Lent** is a time where we focus in a more deliberate way on the practices of *Prayer*, *Fasting*, *and Almsgiving*. Incorporating these three pillars of the spiritual life into our own lives will aid us in deepening our relationship with the Lord. Each of these three call us to a deeper conversion as we strive to give our entire lives over to the Lord. Let us begin thinking now how we will incorporate these practices into our lives this **Lenten season**.

FEAST OF ST. BLAISE AND THE BLESSING OF THROATS

St. Blaise served as the fourth century Bishop in Sebastia, known today as Silva in modern-day Turkey. Trained as a doctor, he served the people of his city faithfully in this vocation for a number of years. After the death of the local bishop, St. Blaise, with overwhelming requests from the local faithful, was appointed to succeed him. After his ordination and during the persecutions initiated under the Emperor Licinius, St. Blaise was imprisoned.

As he was being led to prison, St. Blaise was permitted to stop and save a nearby boy choking on a fish bone. Later that day, the boy's mother, filled with gratitude, brought candles to St. Blaise to light his cell at night. Refusing to renounce the Faith under torture, he was beheaded shortly after. Given these accounts, St. Blaise is known as the patron of those with illnesses of the throat and the blessing of St. Blaise is given with two candles.

In honor of the **Feast of St. Blaise**, we will offer our annual **Blessing of Throats** after all Masses this coming weekend (February 3rd/4th).



ST JOSEPH BOLIVIAN MISSION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This program began at St. Joseph's in 1985, with parishioners sponsoring children through scholarships to provide tuition, uniforms, school supplies and more, so they may receive an education at Santa Maria Mazzarello School in Bolivia. Because of the generosity of our sponsors, many children were able to attend school and have furthered their education by becoming professionals enabling them to help their parents financially and also give back to the poor communities they grew up in. The school year in Bolivia begins February 1st and concludes in October. Scholarships are still \$90 (\$10/month for 9 months) per child, plus an optional Christmas donation.
