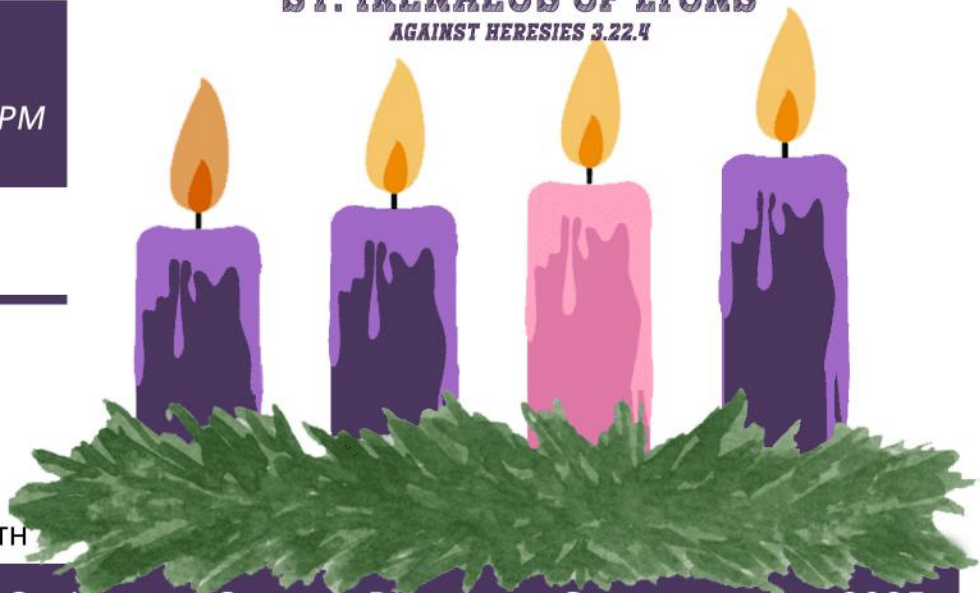

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT - DECEMBER 21, 2025

A special **“Welcome Home!”** to all our university students on their winter break and all of our military personnel on leave with us this coming **Christmastide**.

This weekend (Dec. 20th/21st), the Church celebrates the **Fourth Sunday of Advent**. As we enter the final days that lead us to **Christmas**, we count down the remaining hours until we celebrate the birth of the MESSIAH. In these last days, the Church invites us to step back from the noise of the world and seek out that quiet in our hearts, just as Israel once went into the wilderness to hear the voice of John, so that we may prepare more faithfully and joyfully to welcome our REDEEMER on **Christmas Day**.

This quiet of the heart can be found in simple practices, such as lighting the candles of our **Advent** wreath, praying together as a family, or contemplating the Nativity scene. In each of these moments, we are preparing our hearts to welcome the CHRIST-CHILD. Reducing distractions and practicing small acts of charity create space for grace. When our homes become places of prayer and love, they truly become a dwelling place for the NEWBORN KING.

CHRISTMAS MASS SCHEDULE

Each Christmas Mass reveals a different facet of the same great mystery. On Christmas Eve, the Church turns our eyes to the long waiting of Israel, showing us that the Child in the manger was promised from the beginning. At Midnight, heaven breaks its silence as the angels proclaim His birth. And, on Christmas Day, St. John lifts the veil and shows us who the Child truly is: the eternal Word made flesh, Emmanuel, God with us.

Similarly, each of our Masses offer a unique element. On **Christmas Eve** (Wednesday, Dec. 24th), **Mass will be offered at 4 PM and 6 PM**. The 4 PM Mass will include the blessing of our Nativity scene in the Church and music will be led by our Children’s Choir. The 6 PM Mass will have music led by our Adult Choir, in addition to a prelude of **Christmas Music and Carols at 5:30 PM (prior to Mass)** to raise our hearts in preparation for Mass.

On **Christmas Day** (Thursday, Dec. 25th), **Mass will be offered at both Midnight and 9 AM**. The Midnight Mass (*which is at midnight!*) will be offered solely by candlelight and Christmas lights. The 9 AM Mass will have a *Christmas Brunch* offered afterwards in the Parish Social Hall. If you are planning to attend our annual **Christmas Day Brunch**, please see the sign-up sheet in the Narthex this weekend.

As always, we are preparing to welcome many guests this Christmas season. Thank you ahead of time for your warm and welcoming embrace for those joining us. If you know of someone with nowhere to go, please invite them to join us in prayer for our Christmas celebrations. There are additional postcards with our Christmas Mass Times in the Narthex for you to take and share. An invitation to Mass could be the greatest Christmas gift one may ever receive.

The origin of the word Christmas



The word "Christmas" comes from the Old English phrase **Christes maesse** ("Christ's Mass")—that is the Mass celebrated in honor of Christ's birth. From this original reference to a particular Mass celebrated in the Church's liturgical year, the term came to apply both to the day on which the Mass was celebrated and to the liturgical season associated with it (i.e., the Christmas season, a.k.a. Christmastide).
