This weekend, the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday of Easter. As this Sunday's Gospel references the theme of the Good Shepherd (regardless of which year of the Lectionary cycle we are in) it is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. In 1964, it also received a third name as Pope St. Paul VI established it as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

Our nation adds a fourth name to this weekend as well: **Mother's Day**. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson established the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day, which is "a public expression of love and reverence for the mothers of our country." We wish a happy Mother's Day to all of the mothers of our parish! Whether the mother of a child, grandmother, adoptive mother, aunt, godmother, spiritual mother, and all those who share in any way in the vocation of motherhood, know of our love and gratitude for you.

How beautiful it is that both our Church and national celebrations can be seen to overlap this weekend in, ultimately, the celebration of vocations (Priesthood, Religious Life, Married Life, Motherhood, Fatherhood, and Consecrated Single Life). This is a great reminder that each of us, no matter who we are, is called by the Lord. In the words of our Holy Father, Pope Francis: God "has a plan for each of you: to discover that plan and to respond to your vocation is to move toward personal fulfillment."

The Lord calls each of us to aid in His ministry; To be His presence, His hands and His feet, to the world. In our vocation, we live out this call and help to bring the beauty of Christ to the most unexpected places.

## CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA—SUMMER STUDIES

Though it's been some time since I last mentioned my CUA courses, they have continued. This past week, I completed my final exam for the Spring semester and our course in Roman Law. Providing a historical overview of the Roman legal system, dating back 2800 years, we saw how the system developed over time and how it heavily influenced our own legal systems today (both in the Church and throughout the modern world).

In addition to completing the semester, I also received confirmation that my summer semester will resume meeting in person. This means that, throughout June and July, I will once again be away in Washington, DC, for studies. At the end of July, I will be taking my oral candidacy exam, which is the culmination of these past four years of studies. Once I return home in August, I will begin working on my dissertation for the licentiate degree.

During my absence this summer, the Bishop will be assigning a priest to St. Joseph. I do not yet know who our temporary "summer associate" will be, but I look forward to sharing with them some of the good things that they can expect to be a part of. I will also be returning several times throughout the summer to celebrate a number of Sacraments that have already been planned in the parish (weddings) and for the diocese (ordinations).

Though my studies aren't yet finished, I will start work with our Tribunal this coming September. As one of our Advocates in the Tribunal is going to Rome for further studies, I've been asked to assist the Tribunal staff during her absence throughout the next year. Thankfully, this additional assignment will not greatly affect my ministry here. It does mean, however, that I will need to dedicate one day a week to working at our Tribunal in Fort Wayne. Otherwise, the rest of my time will continue to be dedicated to our parish.






