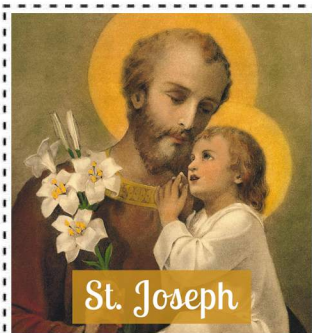

MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY, June 16, 2019- C

Happy Father's Day! To all of the fathers in our parish, whether the father of a child, a grandfather, a godfather, a spiritual father, know of our profound gratitude for your fatherhood. In the great vocation of fatherhood, you reflect the love, strength, generosity, wisdom, and mercy of God the Father. Your witness of love has helped each of us grow deeper in our relationship with Jesus Christ. May you experience God's blessing in your life today (and everyday!) as we celebrate the gift of fatherhood and may St. Joseph, foster-father of our Lord and protector of the Church, be with you this day.

Trinity Sunday, which we celebrate this weekend following Pentecost, is an ancient celebration of the Holy Trinity. With the rise of Arianism, a 4th Century heresy denying Jesus' divinity, the Church defined and defended Jesus' divine sonship at the Council of Niceae (325 AD). From this council we received the Nicene Creed, the same Creed we profess together every Sunday after the general intercessions. Following the council, many early Church Fathers, such as Sts. Athanasius (373 AD) and Ephrem (373 AD), composed prayers and hymns to emphasize the doctrine of the Trinity.

Exalting the triune nature of God, these prayers and hymns were adopted into use during the Church's liturgies in the 4th and 5th Centuries. By the 12th Century, the Solemnity of Trinity Sunday as we know it today was introduced and, by the 13th Century, was added to the universal Church calendar by Pope John XXII. This celebration highlights the relationship between God the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit, as reflected in our readings today. This relationship is one of true love, a love that gives itself fully and completely to another. This love is, of course, shown to us perfectly in the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the Cross, which we are made present to at each and every Mass.

We are invited into this relationship of true love and have begun to participate in it as "the love of God has been poured into our hearts" (Romans 5:5) through the Holy Spirit. Our celebration of Father's Day offers a glimpse of this relationship here on earth as we see it reflected in the self-sacrificial love given by fathers (and mothers) to their children. This complete gift of self reveals, though veiled, a vision of the love that God Himself offers to each of us, His beloved children.

Our bulletin cover this weekend is a portion of the Trinity Dome from the National Shrine in Washington, DC. This central dome of the Basilica was completed only two years ago on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. Circling the base of the dome is the text of the Nicene Creed. Surrounding the image of the Trinity pictured on the cover is an image of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, patroness of our country, and a procession of saints who have a strong association with our country. In this dome, we see the desire of our hearts: To participate fully in the triune love of God as members of the Communion of Saints.

PARISH CENSUS AND OUTREACH

All registered parishioner families at St. Joseph's should have received a letter from the parish this week detailing our upcoming **parish outreach**. (If you did not receive a letter, please contact the parish office.) As mentioned in past columns, we are at the very beginning of forming a five-year-plan for our parish. This will start with door-to-door outreach where groups of two parishioners will visit every registered parish household to update our parish census. As noted in the letter that was mailed, if you would prefer to not be visited, please contact the parish office by phone or email to let us know. I look forward not only to return to St. Joseph's in August, but to work together with each of you in the coming year as we prayerfully discern and guide the direction of our parish family for the years to come.

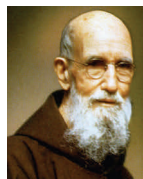
