## THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST; CORPUS CHRISTI, PROCESSION: JUNS 18, 2017 (11<sup>TH</sup> SUN. ORD. TIME)

### "Happy Fathers' day"

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, in the name of the Lord Jesus, I say peace with you all. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

I hope you still remember that we shall have Eucharistic Procession today Sunday June 18, the CORPUS CHRISTI, after the 7:30 a.m. Mass.

The Lord Himself said: "This is my Body. This is my Blood. My body is real food and my blood is real drink". My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Holy Eucharist is the body and blood of Christ; it is real food and real drink. The Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist, is the presence of the Lord among us his people. In ordinary circumstances of life, food and drink are the most essential need of the human person. What food is to the body, is what the Holy Eucharist is to the human soul. The importance of the Holy Eucharist cannot be over emphasized. It is the center of our Christian life. It is the center of our Christian Catholic life. It is apex, the pivot of our life here on earth.

In the celebration of the Holy Mass, we have two tables: "the table of the Word and the table of the table of the Eucharist". The Lord Jesus is present in both tables. That is why in the 1<sup>st</sup> Reading, Moses said to the people, "Remember how for forty years now the Lord your God, has directed all your journey in the desert ... Do not forget the Lord, your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt ..." He directed them by the Pillar of Cloud by day and Pillar of Fire by the night. This was the sign of the presence of God among his people. And in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading, Paul admonished the Corinthians and all of us and said: "Brothers and sisters: The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the Blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? So, the bread is the Body of Christ and the wine is the Blood of Christ. Do you believe in this Doctrine? We need to believe in it.

**In the Gospel; Jn 6:51-58: The Lord Jesus himself said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Do you believe in it? The Jews did not believe him, when He said it, so He firmly said again: "Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise him up on the last day." So we must eat it, in order to be saved. But we must be worthy before we eat it. For this, St. Paul warned us and said that if anyone eats or drinks it unworthily, the person is guilty of sacrilege. We should desire to eat and drink the Body and Blood of Christ, for our salvation. But unfortunately some of us desire and hunger for things of less value such as power, authority, prestige, honor, money, respect etc.. These are good if we possess them in God.**

So, in the Holy Eucharist the Lord Jesus, with his Father and the Holy Spirit is present, among us, His people. The presence of the Lord among us is real. He promised to be with us till the end of time. When Saul was travelling to Damascus to persecute the Christians, the Lord Jesus encountered him on the road and said, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" He did not say, "Why are you persecuting my followers?" Thus, all the members of Christ are his body. OK!

Therefore, after the 7:30 a.m. Mass there will be Eucharistic Procession. The procession is one of the ways we show our faith in the Lord Jesus, that He is present in the Eucharist. Do you believe this? If you believe, then make sure that you join the procession. For we are not only washed clean in the blood of the Lamb, we come into communion through the body and blood of the Lamb. We need to praise and thank God for this precious gift and pray that the Eucharist will nourish us and make us worthy citizen of heaven.

**Today is fathers' Day, so dear fathers "Happy Father's Day". Let me briefly mention the duty of fathers in the Family: Every adult male married or not married is a father. So, it is the duty of every father to love all around him, in the home, in the office and everywhere. If you are married you need to love your wife, support the family, even at the risk of your life. He should stand by his wife and children in all circumstances, except in evil, loving, teaching, directing, instructing, guiding, advising, leading, caring, and forgiving the wife, children and all around him. That is what it means to be a father and a husband. A good father trains his children. Sir 30:1-3 says, "He who loves his son (and daughter too) chastises him/her often, that he/she may be his joy when he/she grows up, ... Vs. 7 says: "He who spoils his son/daughter will have many wounds to bandage". Do not be afraid to train and instruct your children. It is your holy duty. Do it well. Father/husband read Ephesians, 5:21-33.**

Msgr. Pius will be out of town from June 19 to 23, 2017 for Priests' Annual Retreat at State Park at Angola. Be assured, I will pray for each every one of you.
