Our Love & Prayers

6TH SUNDAY OF EASTER, MAY 26, 2019-C

As we as a nation commemorate **Memorial Day** this weekend, may we remember and pray for the courageous men and women who have laid down their lives in service to our nation for the sake of freedom and peace. *Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.* May we also pray for the families of these men and women, that our Lord will fill their homes and their lives with His strength and love. All are welcome to join us as we begin **Memorial Day (Monday, May 27th) with morning Mass at 9:00 am.**

Fr. Silvino, who will be with us throughout June, informed me this week that he will be participating in the annual diocesan Priest Retreat that occurs during the first week of June. In addition, the various priests who are often able to substitute at the parish for daily Masses on days when I am away will also be away at the retreat. Due to these unforeseen circumstances, I'm afraid that we will have to make a few changes to our **daily** Mass schedule for the <u>first week of June</u> (weekend Masses will <u>not</u> be affected).

Daily Mass from Tuesday, June 4th, through Friday, June 7th, will be cancelled. Additionally, our weekday times of exposition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and confession will also be cancelled that first week of June (again, our weekend schedule will not change). This also means that our new addition of adoration and confession every Wednesday evening (as announced in last week's bulletin) will not become a part of our weekly parish schedule until **Wednesday**, **June 8th**. The Church will, of course, remain open for private prayer throughout the week. I apologize for this inconvenience.

At the beginning of May, you may recall that we offered an additional evening Mass on the first Friday of the month, a day dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This evening Mass, celebrated in addition to our normal daily Mass, was offered as a Low Mass according to the 1962 Missal (also known as the Extraordinary Form of the Mass), meaning the prayers (except for the Readings and Homily) were prayed in Latin. We had a wonderful attendance for this evening Mass and a very engaging discussion following the Mass regarding both the 1962 Missal, the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council, and devotion to the Sacred Heart.

Since that time, I've been asked multiple times if this additional Mass would become a monthly practice or if it was a one-time occurrence. Due to the hecticness of the summer schedule and my extended absence, we will not be able to offer this additional Mass time on First Friday in either June or July. We will, however, resume this devotional practice when I return in August. For your planning purposes, we will resume offering our additional evening Mass for First Fridays on Friday, August 2nd. This Mass will continue to be offered as a Low Mass according to the Extraordinary Form and will be scheduled in addition to our normal daily Mass.

As we enter into this Sixth Week of Easter, our readings are preparing us for the Ascension of our Lord (celebrated this coming weekend). Though our Lord has ascended to the right hand of the Father, His ministry continues to this day through His Church, under the guidance and protection of the Holy Spirit. We, as members of the mystical Body of Christ through our baptism, continue His ministry everyday of our lives as we strive for holiness. The challenges and struggles we face will vary according to our vocations and state in life. Yet, as many parts of one body, we are all still called to that fullness of the Christian life. This coming Saturday, June 1st, we will have the opportunity to pray for our brothers in Christ whose vocations have led them to the ministerial priesthood. Dcn. Jose Arroyo, Dcn. Dan Niezer, and Dcn. Spenser St. Louis will be ordained to the eternal priesthood of Jesus Christ by Bishop Rhoades, himself a successor to the Apostles, and begin their lives of dedicated service to their Bride, the Church. The Mass of Ordination will be this Saturday, June 1st, at the Cathedral in Fort Wayne at 11:00 am. The Mass is open to all and, if you've never had the chance to experience an ordination before, I would strongly encourage you to attend.
