

#### NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME-AUGUST 8, 2021

This weekend (August 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup>), the Church is celebrating the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. We continue our deviation from the Gospel of St. Mark and remain in the Gospel of St. John throughout the Bread of Life Discourse. Next weekend, however, we will find ourselves away from both the Gospels of St. Mark and St. John. Instead, we hear from the Gospel of St. Luke. This deviation in our lectionary cycle arises as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary next Sunday.

The Solemnity of the Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation. This year, however, this solemnity falls on Sunday. As such, we will celebrate it instead of the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. This means that our prayers and readings for next weekend will be those for the Assumption and not for the Twentieth Sunday. The following weekend, we will return to the Gospel of St. John and conclude the Bread of Life Discourse.

In preparation for this continuation from the Gospel of St. John, I would encourage you to read **John 6:51-58** sometime this week. This passage, which we would normally hear on the Twentieth Sunday of Ordinary **Time**, is where Jesus teaches that whoever eats His flesh and drinks His blood will live forever. From this passage and the words of our Lord, we especially gain a clear understanding of the Real Presence in the Eucharist.

Our bulletin cover this weekend reflects this part of the Bread of Life Discourse. Turning to both Old Testament and New Testament examples, we see the literal meaning of "eating" that Jesus uses in the original Greek of the Sacred Scriptures. As this language, utilizing such a literal meaning, causes surprise and disbelief among His hearers (John 6:52). Jesus, however, does not change His words; Instead, he reasserts that which He has already proclaimed (John 6:54-56): "My flesh is true food. My blood is true drink."

#### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES RESUMING SOON

The beginning week of August means that summer is almost over. Many of our school children will be returning to school this coming week. After the dust settles and families return to their normal school routines, our Religious Education classes will resume on Sunday, September 12th. Don't miss our Registration Night, complete with Pizza and Sundae Bar, after the Vigil Mass on Saturday, August 28th.

Our Religious Education (RE) Classes are open to all of our parish schoolchildren, from Kindergarten through Eighth Grade and, for our Youth Group, all of our highschoolers. RE registration forms will be passed out at the **Registration Pizza and Sunday Bar** (Saturday, Aug. 28<sup>th</sup>). If you have children in the age range for our RE Classes, but are not yet registered as parishioners, please contact the Parish Office (260-824-1380) as soon as possible to register and to learn more about our RE Classes.

As the Church has consistently taught, parents are the primary teachers of their children in the Faith. When bringing children forward for baptism, parents and godparents promise to bring their children up "in the practice of the Faith." This is reiterated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, which notes that "parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children" (Para. 2223). It is our privilege, then, as a parish to assist the parents of our families with this great responsibility for our youth. May our RE classes always continue to supplement that relationship with Jesus Christ which is first found and built upon in each home.
