On Palm Sunday, priests will wear red vestments in keeping with the Church's focus on the Lord's glorious Passion



PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD - MARCH 28, 2021

The joy of **Palm Sunday** (March 27th/28th) leads us into **Holy Week** and the **Sacred Paschal Triduum**. The crowd's cries of "*Hosanna!*" are quickly replaced with their calls to "*Crucify Him!*" These coming days will bring us into the most intense moments of **Lent**. On **Passion Sunday** (*last weekend*), the image of Christ crucified and the images of the saints were veiled and hidden from our sight. The violet veiling, marked by the color of penance, reminds us of the sufferings of Christ, together with our own need for penance, in reparation for our sins.

These coming days truly enter us, as a visual people, into the mysteries of salvation. On **Holy Thursday**, after the **Mass of the Lord's Supper**, the tabernacle shall be emptied, the sanctuary lamp extinguished, and the altar stripped bare. We strip the altar in preparation for the Crucifixion. On **Good Friday**, the Crucifix, which was veiled on **Passion Sunday**, will be unveiled. The true price of salvation is dramatically laid bare before our eyes as the chant cries out: **Behold**, **the wood of the Cross**, **on which hung the Savior of the world! Come, let us adore!**

All of this makes the **Easter Vigil** that much more spectacular: the Easter fire, lit in darkness, leads to our Paschal candle guiding us into a church that, throughout the Vigil liturgy, will become full of candlelight. When the *Gloria* (which will be the first hymn to pass our lips together as a parish family in over a year) is sung, the lights of the church are lit. Now seeing clearly, we welcome the reappearance of the image of the saints, beautiful flowers, and iconography of the Resurrection.

Within these many liturgies (all of which are listed on our Holy Week Schedule), we also look forward to welcoming out of town guests to our parish. Please be mindful of the hospitality we should have for our guests. (Many who have been away during the pandemic are also likely to come to Mass for the first time in quite a while.) Let us make sure that we are ready to welcome all and make all feel at home at St. Joseph.

INDIANA MASK MANDATE

Gov. Holcomb announced that, on April 6th, the state "mask mandate" will become a "mask advisory." How this will affect our parish policies? Our diocesan directives are **independent** of any state directive. Per our diocesan directives, Bishop Rhoades continues to request that all parishes in our diocese adhere to our social distancing and masking policies. As always, thank you for continuing to respect Bishop Rhoades' directives on these practices.

FR. DAVID'S SUMMER UPDATE

The Canon Law School of the Catholic University of America will offer the entire Summer 2021 Semester online. Instead of having to travel to Washington, D.C., I will be able to remain at our parish throughout the summer. This does mean, however, that I will have a full course load for June and July, including several hours of online instructions, readings, and written assignments each day. As with last year, we will be making some changes to our weekday schedule in the summer to accommodate my class schedule. As always, thank you for your flexibility in these matters.

Holy Thursday



Jesus celebrates the Last Supper with his Apostles



Jesus institutes the Eucharist and constitutes the Apostles as priests



Displaying great humility, Jesus washes the feet of his Apostles



Gives mandatum, command to love one another as he has loved them



During the agony in the garden, he accepts God's will, then is arrested



At the end of Mass the altar is stripped and all decorations are covered or removed. Even the tabernacle is emptied and all consecrated hosts are moved to an Altar of Repose to mimic the absence and loss felt by the disciples during Jesus' agony and death.

No final blessing as the liturgical day continues



Maintain silence

Spend an hour in adoration

Good Friday



While Jesus was being questioned, Peter denies him three times



Pilate has Jesus scourged and a crown of thorns put on his head



Jesus carries his own cross to Calvary, where he is crucified
